May 5, 2024 1 John 5:1-6

Every time. Every time, I tell you. Every time. Every time I preach on love, it seems that week I get tested and tempted. It goes something like this: I'm doing what I'm supposed to be doing. Then someone comes along, something comes up. It doesn't have to be evil; it doesn't have to be trouble; it can be a gift from God. At another time, with a better attitude, I might welcome that someone, that something, that gift from God. But whenever I preach on love, someone, something comes along that gets in the way of what I'm doing, that pushes my buttons, that stresses and stretches me beyond what I think I should have to handle ... and I show me and my world what a bleep I can be. And I wonder: Why does the God-lived life have to be so hard? Why does God-lived love have to be so hard? Is it the devil tempting? Is it God testing? Is it just me being me? And the answer is probably: "Yes! Yes! Yes!"

Do you find God-lived love hard? If not, why not? If so, why?

Why is the God-lived life so hard? Why is God-lived love so hard? I'll give you the easy answer: we live in a world turned in on its self, sometimes chased and chasing to satisfy its cravings (no matter how dark and twisted they might be); sometimes driven and driving to fix the world without God. We live in a world turned in on its self. Why? Because we've fallen for the lies of the devil who says we're better off on our own than with God, that our way is better than God's way, that our love is better than God's love, that whatever I think love is better than what God says love is. We live in a world working to

surround us and fill us with its cravings, a world working to distract us and cut us off from God. That's the easy answer.

How do the cravings of the world surround us? How do the cravings of the world distract us from God?

There's more to the answer. And this is not so easy. Why is the God-lived life so hard? Why is God-lived love so hard? Because there is a part of me that would rather satisfy my cravings than sacrifice my self to love. There is a part of me that would rather fix my life and my world my way myself than look to God and be part of God's fix. In other words, there is a part of me that likes the devil's lies better than God's truth. So when someone comes along, or something comes up that gets in the way of me and my comfort, me and my convenience, me and my plans, me and my pride, me and my idea of me - because I'm so wrapped up in me and my world, I'm not ready with God, and the voices, the fixes, the answers I hear are the voices, the fixes, the answers of the world and its ruler, the Devil - lie and deny, blame and excuse; "it's your life, live it the way you want" - blah, blah, blah. Me - that's a big part of why the God-lived life is so hard. Me is the big part of why God-lived love is so hard.

When we hear "Me is the big part of why God-lived love is so hard," what is your first response? And then your following responses?

So what's the answer? Instead of listening to the voices inside, instead of listening to the voices out there, listen to Spirit of Christ in John: "If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and

will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. ... My dear children, I write this to you so that you will not sin. But if anybody does sin, we have one who speaks to the Father in our defense—Jesus Christ, the Righteous One. He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the sins of the whole world." When the God-lived life is hard, when God-lived love is hard, and we fail and fall short, here is the way to God's life and love: "Father, forgive me." Then what? You get to know you have Jesus speaking up for you - not lying or denying, not blaming or excusing, but pointing to the cross - your sins are paid for, pointing to your baptism - you are washed and made alive with Jesus for life right with God.

What is your favorite reminder that you are forgiven?

That's where we get to go when someone comes along, when something comes up, and our love stinks. That's where we get to go when the devil and this world tempts and we fall. That's where we get to go when God tests and we fail. In Jesus, we are forgiven, purified, set right with God.

Some people stop there. They say something like: "I'm forgiven, and God loves me just the way I am." And they like that so much they add: "And I love God just the way I am." Never mind that part of the way I am is the work of the devil and that Jesus came to destroy the work of the devil. Never mind that Jesus says: "Deny yourself and follow me." Never mind that part of God's response and solution to the way I am is: "Repent."

John doesn't say: "I'm forgiven, and God loves me just the way I am." John doesn't add; "And I love God just the way I am." No, John has better for us than living and loving "just the way I am."

Instead of "I am the way I am," with Jesus, we have a new identity. We aren't our old selves doomed to relive our past; we aren't our weak selves who can't help it; we aren't the people of the world suckered by Satan to think "I have to live my way or I don't matter, I have to live my way or I can't feel good about myself"; we aren't people of the world wrapped up in ourselves and controlled by our cravings and guilt, our insecurities and our pride. No, that's not us. And so we don't have to live that way. We are born of God. And we get to live that way.

How have you seen someone's perceived identity (whether real or not) affect their thinking, feeling, and living?

How does your perceived identity (whether real or not) affect your thinking, feeling, and living?

Born of God, we get to live like we have a Father - "our Father who art in Heaven" - who loves us as his own. Born of God, we get to live like we have God Himself watching out for us, listening in for us, ready to step in for us. Born of God, we get to live like we have Jesus here with us, even in us, and at the same time, Jesus up in heaven preparing a home for us. Born of God, we get to live like we have the Holy Spirit inside us, connecting us, powering us for life with God. Born of God, we don't have to settle for "I am the way I am." Born of God, we don't have to settle for "it's just me being me." Born of God, we don't have to settle for loving with that kind of love.

What does it mean to you that you are the dearly beloved of the Father in heaven?

What does it mean for you that you have Jesus and his Spirit with you and in you?

Born of God, get to live like we will overcome the world; better, born of God, we get to live like we have already overcome the world. We get to live like the world out there can't stop us, or get us, or control us; we get to live like the world in here [in us] can't stop us or control us. Born of God, we get to live with the life and the love of God.

How? Born of God, we love God's people. How? By loving God and keeping his commands. And how do we love God? By keeping God's commands. At one time, that was the sermon I was going to write for today - we love God by keeping his commands. I think we can see how keeping God's commands is love for God. But how is keeping God's commands love for God's people? That could be a whole sermon; we'll talk about that more in Family Bible Hour.

Which is more important to God - to love him or to obey him?

But first, what can I count on this week? My love will be tempted. My love will be tested. And sometimes this week, my love will sputter and fail. But there is something else we get to know. We get to know the love of God that forgives us in Jesus. And we get to know the victory of Jesus that overcomes - that overcomes the world out there, that overcomes the world in here - so we can live life and love with God. Amen.

FIRST READING 1 John 3:18–24

Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth.

This is how we know that we belong to the truth and how we set our hearts at rest in his presence: If our hearts condemn us, we know that God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. Dear friends, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have confidence before God and receive from him anything we ask, because we keep his commands and do what pleases him. And this is his command: to believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and to love one another as he commanded us. The one who keeps God's commands lives in him, and he in them. And this is how we know that he lives in us: We know it by the Spirit he gave us.

The Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**



SECOND READING 1 John 5:1-6

Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is born of God, and everyone who loves the father loves his child as well. This is how we know that we love the children of God: by loving God and carrying out his commands. In fact, this is love for God: to keep his commands.

And his commands are not burdensome, for everyone born of God overcomes the world. This is the victory that has overcome the world, even our faith. Who is it that overcomes the world? Only the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God.

This is the one who came by water and blood—Jesus Christ. He did not come by water only, but by water and blood. And it is the Spirit who testifies, because the Spirit is the truth.
