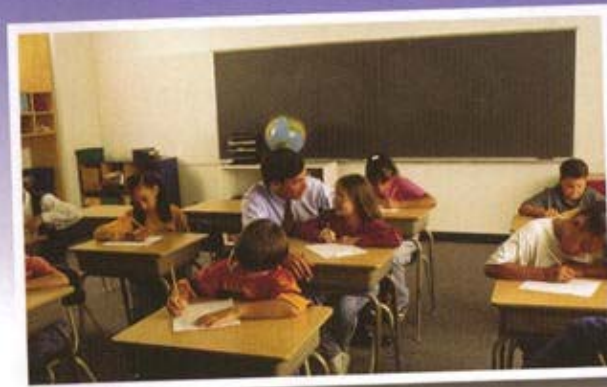
Our Vision and Mission

Academics

Preschool and grades K-8 meet daily, 8:30 to 3:30. St. John offers all basic courses of study and incorporates individual instruction for gifted and remedial students as needed. In addition to basic academic lessons, St. John teaches the message of salvation through Jesus at all grade levels. This is done through daily Bible lessons in 3 year old preschool throughout grade 8, and beginning in grade 6, the children are instructed in the specific teachings of the Bible.

Scholastic achievement is important in evaluating any school's program. St. John subscribes to independent testing to evaluate the strength of its academic programs, and is pleased to share these results with interested parents. Specialized reporting arms parents and faculty with critical information about how each student is progressing, and provides a planning opportunity so each student's potential can be realized.

St. John believes that being able to express oneself verbally and through written communication is an essential life skill. Our faculty creates programs and experiences for children that instill a solid foundation of self expression. The school subscribes to independent testing of writing skills, through ECRA Group. St. John is pleased to share that writing achievement scores of our students are among the best in the region and nation. Our exceptional communication programs ensure our students are prepared not only for higher education, but success in any vocation throughout life.



St. John at a Glance



- Two, three, and five full-day and half-day preschool options available.
- Five full-day or half-day Kindergarten available.

Extracurricular Activities
