Jonah 3-4

'Tis the season. Walk through your neighborhood at night and what do you see in the moonlight? Bones. Bones sticking up from the ground - hand bones, arm bones, leg bones, rib bones. And skulls - skulls still attached and skulls cut off. And skeletons - skeletons hanging from trees and skeletons lying around. And not just any kind of bones and skeletons and skulls - plastic bones and skeletons and skulls.

Now imagine that those bones and skeletons and skulls aren't plastic. They're real bones. Not butcher shop animal bones, but butchered people bones. The bones of your friends and neighbors, the bones of your parents and children. Some of them are the bones of people killed in battle; most of them are the bones of neighbors, family and friends, parents and children tortured and killed after the battle. They made you watch as they tortured and killed; they made you watch as they gouged out eyes and cut off parts. They made you watch as they skinned the dead and the alive. They made you watch as bodies were piled up and hung up on poles for all to see. They made you watch as they tortured and killed. Why? So you would never say "no" to them, so you would never argue or fight back against them again. Who were the they? The Assyrians with Nineveh as their capital.

Now you are Jonah, God's prophet in Israel. You know what the Assyrians have done to the neighboring countries, the peoples, around you. You know the violence and the cruelty of the Assyrians. And you know how the fear of the Assyrians has had your king and country paying the Assyrian king to keep the peace. It turns your stomach; and it sickens your insides to see how weak and pathetic Israel has become. You're supposed to be God's people, God's country. And so you love it, you love it that God has told you, and you get to tell the world: "God will make Israel great again."

It gets even better. God sends you to that Nineveh you hate, to preach God's judgment against Nineveh. You get to preach against your enemy with the power and judgment of God. Sounds good, doesn't it? Jonah didn't think so. He hated the thought of going to Nineveh so much he took off in the opposite direction, then got in a ship to go as far away from Nineveh as possible.

Why? It wasn't fear. Jonah was a man who could sleep through a storm, in the bottom of a ship, while its sailors were terrified. Jonah was a man who could walk past piles of bones and skulls and preach judgment on those who stacked the bones. Jonah was a man who wasn't afraid to argue and complain against God. It doesn't seem to be fear that had Jonah running from God and from Nineveh. Jonah gives us a different answer. It was God's grace and mercy and patience. Jonah wanted Nineveh judged, and he didn't want to give Nineveh any chance to turn to God; he didn't want to give God any reason to show his grace and mercy to Nineveh. What did we hear? Jonah cared more about a plant giving him shade than he cared about even the "most innocent" in Nineveh. He wanted to see all of Nineveh judged and destroyed.

Where do you see you in our lesson? Ever been the bully? Pushing, terrorizing, making people miserable to get your way? At school, at work, at home. Don't be too quick to say "No."

Ever been the Jonah? Maybe you've been on the wrong side of the bully, the abuser, the harasser. Maybe at school, maybe at work, maybe at home. Or maybe you've just seen the bully in action. Either way, you want to see the bully bullied; you want to see that jerk get what's coming to them; you want to see the bully judged and crushed - no grace, no mercy.

Ever been the Jonah? God says: "Go. Go to the one who has sinned against you. Go to the one who has hurt you. Go and win him over for Jesus." Or God says: "Forgive. Forgive those who sin against you." Or God says: "Go. Go and make disciples of all nations," but those nations aren't your kind of people. Or God says: "Love. Love your neighbor as yourself," but those neighbors - you don't want to have anything to do with them or their kind. Ever been the Jonah? When God said, "Go," you turned around the other way? When God wanted to show grace and mercy, you hoped for judgment and cheered for judgment? Ever been the Jonah?

I know I've been both, both the Ninevite and the Jonah. That's why it is so good to see how God is in our lesson. He doesn't have his heart set on judging Nineveh. He wants to show grace and mercy; he gives them a chance to repent.

Some might argue, we might argue. When we're hurt or afraid because of what people have done to us, we might argue: "God's up in heaven; he doesn't know what it's like to hurt like I hurt; he doesn't know what it's like to have to deal with people like them; he doesn't know what it's like to live wondering, waiting, 'What if they do it again?' God doesn't know what he's asking of me."

But Jesus does. Jesus knows hurt and suffering. He knows unfair hurt and suffering. Jesus wasn't on the cross for what he did wrong; Jesus was on the cross to pay for what I, for what we have done wrong. Yes, Jesus knows what it's like to be called by God to go and love, to go and forgive, to go and be hated and rejected, tortured and abused, mocked and ridiculed, spit on and crucified, and through it all to love and forgive. To love and forgive, not just his family and friends, but to love and forgive the soldiers pounding the spikes into his hands and feet.

Jesus knew God's call to grace and mercy, and he answered: "Father, forgive them." Not just for them, but for you and for me. Not just because "they do not know what they are doing," but for you and for me even when we did know what we were doing. For those times we have been the Ninevites making others miserable .... For those times we have been Jonah turning away from the LORD .... For those times, with Jesus, we get to join David: "Blessed is the one whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered. Blessed is the one whose sin the LORD does not count against him .... I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD"— and you forgave the guilt of my sin."

What do we do with that? We know what David did with God's grace and mercy: "Praise the LORD, O my soul. All my inmost being praise his holy name!" David wasn't just talking about saying nice things to God; David set his heart to sharing the grace and mercy of God with people, with sinners who needed the grace and mercy of God.

And what about Jonah? What did Jonah do with God's grace and mercy? We don't know. Unless Jonah himself wrote this little book. Then what do we have? We have old Jonah, judging Jonah in our lesson, and we have new Jonah writing our lesson, new Jonah showing us the grace and mercy in God's heart. Even if Jonah didn't write this book, what a beautiful picture of God's grace and mercy, grace and mercy we get to see for ourselves in Jesus.

So what do we do with God's grace and mercy for the Ninevite, the old Jonah, the sinner in us? What do we do with God's grace and mercy for the Ninevite, the Jonah, the sinner out there? We go. We don't turn around, hunker, and hide. We go. We love. We forgive. With the heart and grace of God, like the new Jonah, we show and tell others the heart and the grace of our God.

That's right. We have something better to share with our world than dead, dry bones. We have something better to share than Ninevite fear or Halloween fun. We have something better to share than "you better do what I want or else." We have something better to share than "a better life for me and mine." In a world full of Ninevite bullies and judging old Jonahs, we have the heart of a new Jonah, a heart filled with the grace and the mercy of God - a new Jonah with a heart ready to go with God - "Let's go and show; let's show and tell!" Amen.

FIRST READING Jonah 3

Then the word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time: "Go to the great city of Nineveh and proclaim to it the message I give you."

Jonah obeyed the word of the LORD and went to Nineveh.

Now Nineveh was a very large city; it took three days to go through it. Jonah began by going a day's journey into the city, proclaiming, "Forty more days and Nineveh will be overthrown." The Ninevites believed God. A fast was proclaimed, and all of them, from the greatest to the least, put on sackcloth.


When Jonah's warning reached the king of Nineveh, he rose from his throne, took off his royal robes, covered himself with sackcloth and sat down in the dust. This is the proclamation he issued in Nineveh:

"By the decree of the king and his nobles:

Do not let people or animals, herds or flocks, taste anything; do not let them eat or drink. But let people and animals be covered with sackcloth. Let everyone call urgently on God. Let them give up their evil ways and their violence. Who knows? God may yet relent and with compassion turn from his fierce anger so that we will not perish."

When God saw what they did and how they turned from their evil ways, he relented and did not bring on them the destruction he had threatened.

SECOND READING Jonah 4

But to Jonah this seemed very wrong, and he became angry. He prayed to the LORD, "Isn't this what I said, LORD, when I was still at home? That is what I tried to forestall by fleeing to Tarshish. I knew that you are a gracious and compassionate God, slow to anger and abounding in love, a God who relents from sending calamity. Now, LORD, take away my life, for it is better for me to die than to live."

But the LORD replied, "Is it right for you to be angry?"

Jonah had gone out and sat down at a place east of the city. There he made himself a shelter, sat in its shade and waited to see what would happen to the city. Then the LORD God provided a leafy plant and made it grow up over Jonah to give shade for his head to ease his discomfort, and Jonah was very happy about the plant. But at dawn the next day God provided a worm, which chewed the plant so that it withered. When the sun rose, God provided a scorching east wind, and the sun blazed on Jonah's head so that he grew faint. He wanted to die, and said, "It would be better for me to die than to live."

But God said to Jonah, "Is it right for you to be angry about the plant?" "It is," he said. "And I'm so angry I wish I were dead."

But the LORD said, "You have been concerned about this plant, though you did not tend it or make it grow. It sprang up overnight and died overnight. And should I not have concern for the great city of Nineveh, in which there are more than a hundred and twenty thousand people who cannot tell their right hand from their left—and also many animals?"

'These who were hired last worked only one hour,' they said, 'and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the work and the heat of the day.'

"But he answered one of them, 'I am not being unfair to you, friend. Didn't you agree to work for a denarius? Take your pay and go. I want to give the one who was hired last the same as I gave you. Don't I have the right to do what I want with my own money? Or are you envious because I am generous?'

"So the last will be first, and the first will be last."


