Have you ever felt too tired for New year's Eve? I know I have. With New Year's Eve, we have one of the busiest times of the year, Christmas, crashing into one of the hardest deadlines of the year - the end of the year. Put the busiest time of the year together wit the hardest deadline of the year - and this time of year can be incredibly exhausting.

But Isaiah's people didn't have Christmas trees and lights and shopping to worry about. And we don't hear anything of New Year's Eve for Isaiah and his people. So why were Isaiah's people so tired? Part of the answer could be: "Maybe they weren't." Our lesson isn't just medicine for the tired; our lesson is vaccine for people who were about to be tired. It's not just a power supply for those short of power today; it's power supply for those who will some day in the future need new power. So even if you're feeling fully powered-up today, this lesson is for you.

Now why was Isaiah giving his people a new power supply? Isaiah knew, God knew, his people were about to feel powerless. Powerless - like when you're slipping on ice and there's nothing you can do. Powerless - like that feeling when you're being held down and beaten and there's nothing you can do. Powerless - beaten down. Powerless - worn out. The Babylonians were coming and they were going to beat Judah down; they would beat her down into dust. And Isaiah's people
would be powerless to fight back; powerless to escape; hopeless, helpless, and worn out. The time was coming when they would need to be re-energized.

When do you need to be re-energized? It's not just Christmas-time and New Year's Eve, is it? So what is it that makes you feel powerless, beaten down? Sometimes it's sickness; or the way age catches up with us and beats our body down - illness and age can be so frustrating, scary, depressing; they can suck the energy out of us. Or it might be watching someone we love sick, hurting, in trouble, and there's nothing we can do about it - and that sucks the energy out of us. Or maybe it's a to-do list that just gets longer and longer and so much never gets done - and that sucks the life out of us.

Other times - who is it, what is the Babylon that beats you down? Someone, something at work? At home? We might wonder "who's going to bully us next? Who's going to lie to us next? Who's going to cheat us next?" Maybe it's the news we watch, some gossip we hear; maybe it's the complaining we feed on. Sometimes it seems we're living on the edge of perdition and we're about to be swallowed up by all the evil out there.
Sometimes we might feel like we're living on the edge of damnation with all the guilt and shame and failure we work in here [our hearts], with all the guilt, the shame, the failure we bottle up in here [our hearts]. I said: "living on the edge of perdition and damnation," but it feels more like dying on the edge of perdition and damnation - doesn't it? - because it sucks the life right out of us.

Sometimes, living on the edge of perdition and damnation worn down and worn out, we might throw up our hands: "Whatever! If they don't care, why should I care? If God doesn't care, why should I care?" Or we might feel too tired, too worn out to throw up our hands, and all we can do is sigh: "My way is hidden from the LORD; my cause is disregarded by my God. My God doesn't care any more."

When we're feeling tapped out like that, a pot of coffee won't give us the energy we need ... turning up the volume on the music won't do it either, will it? So where can we tap in for new power? ${ }^{28}$ Do you not know? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom. ${ }^{29} \mathrm{He}$ gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. ${ }^{30}$ Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; ${ }^{31}$ but those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.

Have you seen how eagles soar? Wouldn't it be great to have energy like that? But eagles don't soar on their own power, do they? The ride the winds. And we don't have to rely on or ride on our own power. "Those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength." Or a better translation: "Those who wait for the LORD will receive new strength." Here's the idea "Those who wait, those who are looking, looking, looking for the LORD will exchange their strength." Looking to the LORD, we
get to trade in our old worn out strength for new re-energized power.

How? Well, sometimes why do we get tapped out? We look at all that's going on in our life and we think we have to carry it all. Look to the LORD and check out his hands - v12"Who has measured the waters in the hollow of his hand, or with the breadth of his hand marked off the heavens? Who has held the dust of the earth in a basket, or weighed the mountains on the scales and the hills in a balance?" Instead of us trying to carry everything, what do we get to do? Let God carry it!

What tires us out? Sometimes it might seem like most all the world is against us. Look to the LORD; check out v15"Surely the nations [everybody and everything that's against you] are like a drop in a bucket ... as dust on the scales.... ${ }^{17}$ Before him all the nations are as nothing; they are regarded by him as worthless and less than nothing. It doesn't matter who is against us; it doesn't matter how many are against us - to your God, they're nothing - nothing he can't handle!

What tires us out? Sometimes we might think we have to hold our world together. Check out where God is - ${ }^{21}$ Do you not know? Have you not heard? ... ${ }^{22} \mathrm{He}$ sits enthroned above the circle of the earth, and its people are like grasshoppers. He stretches out the heavens like a canopy, and spreads them out like a tent to live in. ${ }^{23} \mathrm{He}$ brings princes to naught and reduces the rulers of this world to nothing. Listen to him: ${ }^{25}$ "To whom will you compare me? Or who is my equal?" says
the Holy One. ${ }^{26}$ Lift your eyes and look to the heavens: Who created all these? He who brings out the starry host one by one, and calls them each by name. Because of his great power and mighty strength, not one of them is missing." When we think we have to hold it all together, when we can't hold it all together, stare up into the stars. Your God is up there ruling over all. He knows every star up there by name and he knows every one of you by name. He holds every one of those stars in its place and he holds every one of you in his heart. We don't have to think it's up to us to hold our world together and make every thing right. Instead of thinking about how much I can carry; we get to think about how much God can carry. It's not the size and number of our enemies or our problems that matter; it's the size and power of our God.

And he has what it takes. Check out v28 - "Do you not know? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom."

And then what?" Those who look to the LORD will receive new strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint." Look to the LORD and his strength will be your strength. Amen.

## Gospel

Luke 2:22-40
When the time came for the purification rites required by the Law of Moses, Joseph and Mary took him to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord (as it is written in the Law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male is to be consecrated to the Lord"), and to offer a sacrifice in keeping with what is said in the Law of the Lord: "a pair of doves or two young pigeons."
Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Messiah.

Moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying:
"Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you may now dismiss your servant in peace.
For my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of all nations:
a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of your people Israel."

The child's father and mother marveled at what was said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to Mary, his mother: "This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against, so that the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your own soul too."
There was also a prophet, Anna, the daughter of Penuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was very old; she had lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, and then was a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshiped night and day, fasting and praying. Coming up to them at that very moment, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem.
When Joseph and Mary had done everything required by the Law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee to their own town of Nazareth. And the child grew and became strong; he was filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was on him.

Isaiah is showing us God's power and energy so that we put aside our own power and strength, so that we look to the LORD, not just to renew our power and strength, but we look to the LORD to exchange his power and strength in place of our power and strength.
