Sermon followed by Service

July 23, 202

Some time take a close look at the shields of the Apostles. Some tell us of the life they gave up for Jesus. Some tell us of the death they died for Jesus.

Elijah was so close to being like them. Like when Elijah stood up to King Ahab for leading God's people away from God to worship the rain-god Baal; Elijah stood up to the king: "There will be no more rain until I say so." After that Ahab ordered an international manhunt to hunt Elijah down and have him killed. Ahab's wife Jezebel wasn't content with just hunting Elijah down; she ordered that all the prophets of the LORD be hunted down and killed. Elijah was so close to being like them. Like when Elijah stood alone and challenged Ahab and the prophets of Baal to a showdown; even after Elijah brought down fire and rain from the LORD, Jezebel threatened to have him killed. Or in Naboth's vineyard, when Elijah stood up to Ahab and announced God's bloody judgment on Ahab and Jezebel Again and again, Elijah came so close to being like them.

But God delivered him. And not just from murderous Ahab and Jezebel and all the other God-haters who were against him. God delivered Elijah from death itself, taking him up to heaven in a whirlwind alive.

Why? Why Elijah and not Peter or Paul? Why Elijah and not Isaiah or Jeremiah? Why Elijah and not you or me? We're not told. We know God had something special in mind for Elijah with Jesus. When Jesus was getting his disciples ready for his journey to the cross Some 800 plus years after God took Elijah up to heaven, he brought Elijah back to earth with Moses to meet with Jesus on the Mount of Transfiguration. There the Elijah who stood up to kings and warned them of God's coming judgment, that Elijah stood before the King of Kings to encourage Jesus in his coming judgment. Or better, the Elijah God specially delivered out of this world spoke with Jesus about the way God would specially deliver Jesus out of this world.

Why? Why Elijah? And why this special whirlwind to heaven? It could be as simple as this: Sometimes God likes to reward his people; sometimes God likes to do special, out-of-the ordinary, extraordinary things for his people. While

it's true we may never get the whirlwind treatment, it's also true we may never know how many special, out-of-the-ordinary, extraordinary things God is doing in our lives right now. Thank you, Lord, right?! But why this? For Elijah? Perhaps to reward Elijah. Perhaps to set Elijah apart as God's special prophet to encourage Jesus. Perhaps to show us how special Elijah is. Or perhaps God did this for Elijah to show us something special about himself.

What do we see here about God? How about God's respect and appreciation for Elijah's ministry, for Elijah's difficult ministry, his faithful ministry, and yes, his imperfect, struggling ministry. (A couple weeks ago we talked about those days Elijah just wanted to quit.) As God takes Elijah up into heaven, we are reminded how much God appreciates the gospel ministry of his people. That's so good to see, isn't it? Even though we may struggle and stumble, even though there may be times we see little to show for all our work and sacrifice, God appreciates and he rewards the gospel ministry of his hardworking, faithful people.

Just as it's so good to see God's heart for his ministry servants here in our lesson, it's so good to see how so many of you share God's heart for his ministry servants here at St. John. As we work together in God's gospel ministry, working with each other and working for each other, we may not be able to give each other a whirlwind ride up to heaven, but we can still share the treasures of heaven and earth with those who work with us and for us. I don't say that because you don't; I say that because you do share God's heart.

Then what do we see? We see what the school of prophets saw. Elisha picks up where Elijah left off. Just as Elijah struck the Jordan River with his cloak and the river split, so Elisha strikes the Jordan with Elijah's cloak and the river splits. That's when Elisha knew, that's when the school of prophets knew Elisha was God's man to take over from Elijah.

How do we know? How do I know that I am God's servant to be here? How does Alison know that she is God's servant to be here? I haven't ever split the Jordan or any other river; I don't think Alison has either. So how do we know? The same way that Barnabas and Silas knew in the New Testament. God's church called them. Working through his church, Christ called them. The same thing is true for me and for Alison and for all our teachers. The same thing is true for our Sunday School teachers and our elders who share the Word of God with you on behalf of St. John. We know God has called us to serve with you here because 1) Christ calls through his church, 2) you are his church, 3) you have called us to serve here, 4) so we get to believe, we get to know that Christ has called us and put us here. What does that mean for us? We get to preach and teach, speak up and speak out, lead and serve as if God himself has put us here to do just that - because he has.

(((And so we don't work here - who's the we? As pastor and teachers, as Sunday School Teachers and elders, as people called by St. John to share God's Word - we don't work here because it suits us as long as it suits us. No, we serve with you and we serve for you as servants of God called to serve by God. I don't have a miracle-working cloak to prove it. We have you to prove it.)))

Back to our lesson. Elisha was stepping into some big shoes. So God worked a pair of miracles to set Elisha up and show Elisha off as his prophet. First, we have the men of Jericho come to Elisha: "Our water is bad and so our land is bad." Elisha calls for a bowl of salt; he throws the salt into the spring; the water is healed and made fresh. Elisha could have pointed to himself; instead he pointed to LORD: "**This is what the LORD says: 'I have healed this water.**" A nice way to start ministry; I imagine that warmed a few hearts to Elisha.

What happens next chills the heart. Elisha is on the way from Jericho to Bethel. Some boys - we don't need to think too young, perhaps teens - a gang of boys comes out of the town like a gang of hoodlums and mock Elisha: "Go on up, you baldy." What were they saying? "Go on up the road into Bethel"? "Go on up into heaven like Elijah"? We can't be sure what they meant by "go on up," but we can be sure what was in their hearts. They were mocking, jeering, ridiculing. If they didn't yet know who Elisha was, they were mocking a stranger they should have been respecting. If they did know who Elisha was, they were mocking a prophet of God, and in God's ears, that is no different than mocking God himself. We can't be sure what that gang of troublemakers was saying, but Elisha could hear the evil in their words; he could see the evil on their faces; and so he could feel the evil in their hearts. In the name of the LORD, he calls down a curse on them. Two bears come out of the woods and maul 42 of the troublemakers. God's message was clear: "Don't mess with Elisha." Puts a chill in my heart for all the ways I have mocked and judged those I should have respected. Puts a chill in my heart for all the ways I have mocked and judged, for all the ways I have disrespected and made life difficult for God's servants - at church, in school or Sunday School, at home. Instead of making their lives more difficult, instead of making God's work more difficult for them, I should have gone out of my way to respect them; I should have made it my life to make life and ministry better for them. Makes me thankful I've gotten this far without a bear mauling me or worse.

Makes me thankful to have a God so serious about his ministry team. It's not a small thing to God when people disrespect his servants - whether it's at church, in school, or at home. It's not a small thing to God when people think it's a good thing to mess with his ministry. This ministry that God has entrusted to us isn't just a hobby for him, a fun thing on the side; it's a matter of life and death to God; God gave his Son for this ministry; Jesus gave his life for this ministry. The people that God has entrusted to our ministry aren't just numbers to God - grade numbers, room numbers, salary numbers; the people that God has entrusted to our ministry aren't just fodder to God, fodder to be chewed up and pooped out. The people that God calls to his ministry are precious to him, and that means the people God entrusts to our ministry are precious to him, especially precious because of the ministry he wants to work through us.

God isn't just looking to make this world a better place. He's not just looking to make people happy with themselves and nice to others. God knows the day is coming when this world will be destroyed with fire; he knows that day is coming because he will bring that day of judgment. So God knows our biggest problem, our real problem, isn't that we aren't happy enough with ourselves. In fact, the opposite is true. He knows we are too stuck on ourselves and too stuck on what we imagine happiness to be, too stuck on ourselves and too stuck on what we imagine happiness to be to appreciate the love and the life he has for us. And so we live in a world fighting against God and His Word and His Way, fighting against God in so many ugly, ugly ways. And to make it worse, some days, we set ourselves more with the world than with God.

But that hasn't stopped God. He hasn't stopped loving us; he hasn't stopped wanting to save us for life with him in heaven; he hasn't stopped wanting to save the world for life the way it's supposed to be. And so he gives us what we need. He gives us his Son. For all the ways we have been like Ahab and Jezebel, for all the ways we have mocked and disrespected God's servants, God has given us Jesus to take our place as guilty, to take our place as judged, to take our place as cursed. That's what the cross is about. And now with Jesus, forgiven with Jesus, he gives you his place. He gives you his place as child of God; he gives you his place as servant and partner of God. He gives you his place to share God's life and his love. He gives you his place to share the treasures of heaven with the world around you.

Some days, that might put us with those apostles, with Elijah and Elisha, with the world against us. Then we get to remember, like those apostles, like Elijah and Elisha, we are so blessed - we have God for us and heaven ahead of us. May God bless us to share in and share out his life and his love! Amen.



Fifty men from the company of the prophets went and stood at a distance, facing the place where Elijah and Elisha had stopped at the Jordan. Elijah took his cloak, rolled it up and struck the water with it. The water divided to the right and to the left, and the two of them crossed over on dry ground.

When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, "Tell me, what can I do for you before I am taken from you?"

"Let me inherit a double portion of your spirit," Elisha replied.

"You have asked a difficult thing," Elijah said, "yet if you see me when I am taken from you, it will be yours—otherwise, it will not."

As they were walking along and talking together, suddenly a chariot of fire and horses of fire appeared and separated the two of them, and Elijah went up to heaven in a whirlwind. Elisha saw this and cried out, "My father! My father! The chariots and horsemen of Israel!"

And Elisha saw him no more. Then he took hold of his garment and tore it in two.

Elisha then picked up Elijah's cloak that had fallen from him and went back and stood on the bank of the Jordan. He took the cloak that had fallen from Elijah and struck the water with it. "Where now is the LORD, the God of Elijah?" he asked. When he struck the water, it divided to the right and to the left, and he crossed over.

The company of the prophets from Jericho, who were watching, said, "The spirit of Elijah is resting on Elisha." And they went to meet him and bowed to the ground before him. "Look," they said, "we your servants have fifty able men. Let them go and look for your master. Perhaps the Spirit of the LORD has picked him up and set him down on some mountain or in some valley."

"No," Elisha replied, "do not send them."

But they persisted until he was too embarrassed to refuse. So he said, "Send them." And they sent fifty men, who searched for three days but did not find him. When they returned to Elisha, who was staying in Jericho, he said to them, "Didn't I tell you not to go?"

The people of the city said to Elisha, "Look, our lord, this town is well situated, as you can see, but the water is bad and the land is unproductive."


"Bring me a new bowl," he said, "and put salt in it." So they brought it to him.

SERMON

INSTALLATION OF OUR NEW TEACHER Miss Alison Lindemann – 5th & 6th Grade Teacher

M: Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ said to his Church: "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

A Christian school is one way we carry out our Lord's command as we let children come to him and do not hinder them, but rather nurture them with the life-giving word of God. We do this trusting God's promise:

"Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it."

Exhortation to the Teacher-Elect

M: Dear sister in Christ, St. John Evangelical Lutheran Church has called you to serve as teacher. You have been prepared for this ministry by careful instruction in the Word of God so that you carry out your duties in conformity with that Word.

As an ambassador of Christ you are to teach the pure doctrine of God's Word, to instruct the young in the way of salvation, and always to have in your heart the spiritual welfare of every soul under your care. You are to devote yourself to the meditation and study of the Scriptures. You are to be an example to others in godliness and Christian living, putting no stumbling block in anyone's path, so that the ministry will not be discredited.

You are to speak the truth in love, as the apostle Peter reminds us: "Love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins. If anyone speaks, he should do it as one speaking the very words of God. If anyone serves, he should do it with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ. To him be the glory and the power for ever and ever."

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom, and as you sing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs with gratitude in your heart to God. And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

The ability to carry out this calling is not in us, but comes alone from God, as St. Paul reminded the Corinthian Christians: "Not that we are competent in ourselves to claim anything for ourselves, but our competence comes from God."

The Holy Spirit, who himself has called you to this ministry, will be with you.

M: In keeping with the word and will of the Lord, you are about to be installed as teacher at St. John Lutheran School. I ask you, in the presence of God and this congregation:

Are you fully determined to carry out this work according to the grace which God will give?

- M: Do you believe that the canonical books of the Old and New Testament are the inspired Word of God and the only infallible rule of faith and practice?
- R: I do.
- M: Do you accept the three Ecumenical Creeds—the Apostles', the Nicene, and the Athanasian—as faithful testimonies to the truth of the Holy Scriptures, and do you reject all the errors which they condemn?
- R: I do.
- M: Do you solemnly promise that all your teaching will conform to the Holy Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessions?
- R: I do.
- M: Will you give faithful witness to Christ in the world that God's love may be known in all that you do and say?
- R: I will, and I ask God to help me.
- M: Almighty God, who has given you the will to do these things, graciously give you the strength and compassion to perform them.

Exhortation to the Congregation

M: Brothers and sisters in Christ, you have heard the solemn promise given by the teacher you have called. I urge you, therefore, to receive her with joy and to keep in mind always what the Word of God expects of you as members of this congregation:

Work together with her for our Lord's kingdom so that by your works of service the Body of Christ might be built up.

Help her by your word and example in teaching the young, remembering how the Scriptures urge you to bring up your children in the training and instruction of the Lord.

Pray for her continually, that her ministry among you may be greatly blessed and that she may have a cheerful spirit in all her duties.

Provide also for her physical needs, for the Lord says, "The worker deserves his wages."

Honor and love her, as the apostle Peter urges, "Live in harmony with one another; be sympathetic, love as brothers, be compassionate and humble."

- M: I now ask you, in the presence of God: Are you willing to receive her as a servant of Christ? Will you show her love and honor, and support her with your gifts and prayer? If so, answer: we will, and we ask God to help us.

- M: Students of St. John School, Jesus our Savior has promised eternal life to those who trust in him. Show your love to Jesus by cheerfully obeying your teachers, so that you benefit from their instruction, especially as they teach you God's saving Word. Give them honor and respect, so that their work will be a joy for them and an eternal blessing to you.

Alison Lindemann, I install you as teacher at St. John Lutheran School in the name of the Father and of the Son (†) and of the Holy Spirit.

May the Lord pour out on you his Holy Spirit for the work committed to you that you may faithfully proclaim the gospel.

Continue to bless our labors here, so that your Word may dwell richly in us and in our children and that your name may be glorified. Move our students to godliness and obedience and cause them to grow through her instruction in your Word, so that she may serve you throughout her life and finally inherit eternal life. Help us at all times to regard our teachers as those whom you have sent, so that we support them in their ministry and pray and work for the welfare of our school. Hear us for Jesus' sake.
- M: Go, then, take up the work to which you have been called.




