Matthew 7:24

Did you get to build any sand castles this summer? When I was your age, we went to Camp Shetek on Lake Shetek in Minnesota. On the beach we'd build our sand castles and forts and harbors. It was great; you could imagine yourself as governor building your fort against the pirates, and if you didn't feel like being the governor, you could smash it all down and imagine yourself a pirate building your hide-out, and if you didn't feel like being a pirate any more, you could imagine yourself as a typhoon monster smashing it all down.

It was great; you could make yourself and your world however you wanted yourself and your world to be. We seem to like that, don't we? But what always happened? It all came crashing down. Sometimes fast, sometimes slow, but it all came crashing down. No surprise, is it? But that doesn't stop us, does it? We love to build on shifting sand. Not just on vacation, not just on the beach. And no matter how many times it goes bad, somehow we think we can make building on sand work for us. We see it on the beaches; we see it on the news with houses sliding into the oceans; we see it in our lesson.

Our lesson sounds pretty simple, doesn't it? Two guys build themselves a house; one builds his house on sand; the other builds on rock. A storm blows through; the house built on sand collapses; the house built on the rock stands solid and safe. What's the point? Build your life on a solid foundation. Build your life on Jesus and his Word. Easy lesson, right?

So why did the foolish man build on sand? Didn't he know what he was doing? What was he thinking? "The storm won't get my house. I'm too busy ... it'll cost too much ... I like building on sand better"? Was he even thinking at all? We see the houses on the ocean in California. Year after year we see house after house collapse. And new house after new house gets built much the same way. And what do we say: "What were they thinking? How foolish can they be?"

It's easy to point fingers, but sometimes we're like that foolish man building on sand, aren't we? We know storms are coming. We know storms are blowing that could wipe out our finances, our job, our family, our life. We know trouble is coming, sickness is coming, death is coming. We know the storms are coming. We see people all around us blown down and blown away. But so often, what do we think? "It won't happen to me, at least not any time soon; I've got time." Or "I'm too busy; I don't have time." Or "I know it would be good for me for us to build our lives on Jesus more, but ... but ... but ... but." Take away the excuses, I wonder if this would some times be closer to the truth: "I'd build on the Rock, but Bible time with Jesus just isn't my thing; I have better things to do."

You know who loves that kind of talk? The devil loves hearing that kind of talk; he loves watching that kind of life; he loves excuses. But since when has building life on excuses done anyone any good?

Thank God we don't have to build on sand or on excuses! For that matter, we don't need to build on guilt or fear. Think back to your summers building sand castles and forts. Do you remember your brother or sister coming in and smashing everything you built? Do you remember the look on their faces - smiling, cheering as they crushed your world? God isn't that way. He isn't looking to destroy; his heart isn't set on knocking you down and cheering. His heart is set on setting us safe and secure in a life of blessing. Some days, what does that mean? Something that may not always be easy. Moving us, moving us from sand to rock, from a life that will crumble to a life that will last.

So what is the Rock that our God has for us? We might think of family and friends; they can be great blessings in the storm. But sometimes they're built on sand; sometimes they are the storm kicking sand in our faces. But there is a family, there is a Friend who isn't built on sand, a Friend who will stick by you, a Friend with the right answers who will say what needs to be said and do what needs to be done, a Friend who considers you family, a Friend who is eager to be Father, Husband, Brother for you, a Friend and Family who will love you no matter the cost.

So when the storms come at school, at work ... no, how about this? Before the storms come, before the stock market crashes, before your house falls apart, before you don't know how you're going to keep it together - instead of building on sand and excuses, build on the One who holds everything together. Before the storms come and "you don't know what to do," instead of following feelings that spin this way and that, build

your life on the One who does know, who knows better than Google or any feeling you might have. Before the storms come and your head and heart get filled with ugly voices bringing you down, fill your head and your heart with the voice of the One who knows you better than you know you, who loves you even better than you love you. Fill your heart and mind with his voice; he says: "I love you; I forgive you; I've got you today; and I've got you forever!" Yes, before the death storm blows, and it's time to meet your Maker, set your life on the Rock.

Why? Because building our lives on wishing thinking: "It won't happen to me," building our lives on excuses: "I'm too busy, it's too much work," is like building our lives on sand that just won't hold up to the storms that are coming our way.

So what is the Rock that our God has for us? Jesus and his Word. And what makes Jesus and his Word to be the perfect Rock for us? He weathered the storms. How? Instead of building on sand and living the life of the world, Jesus trusted God and built his life doing what God wanted him to do. Even when the world had him hurting horribly, even when God had him hurting horribly on the cross - "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me" - Jesus built his life on the Rock of God and his Word. He trusted God - "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." And what did God do? He took Jesus safe and secure to heaven and raised him to life, alive and well forever.

If we could build our lives like that ... if we could trust God like Jesus ... if we could follow God like Jesus ... we'd be set for the storms too. Somehow that doesn't sound all that comforting,

does it? Why? I don't trust God like Jesus; I can't follow God like Jesus.

So remember why Jesus came here. He didn't come here just to show us how to weather the storms. He came here to take our place in the storm. He didn't come here just to be our example and Teacher. Jesus came to be our Savior and Substitute. Instead of God judging us and making us pay for building our lives on sand, instead of judging us and making us pay for our excuses, instead of judging us and making us pay for the wreckage we cause by building our lives on sand, God judged Jesus on the cross and he paid. We don't have to go through life kicking ourselves; with Jesus, we don't have to live in fear of God making us pay. God has Jesus for you. With Jesus, God sees you building right, building on the Rock. With Jesus, God holds you as right, right for his love, right for his home in heaven. With Jesus, it doesn't matter how hard the storms blow - you have God to keep you safe and secure.

What do we do with that? We leave wishful thinking behind and check our foundations. We leave our excuses behind and build our lives on the Rock, on Jesus and his Word. That means more than just talking some talk - "I believe in Jesus; I believe in the Bible; I believe." Build on the Rock means: Walk the talk. Walk God's talk.

God doesn't shazam his talk into our hearts and minds; he speaks to us in his Word. It doesn't all make sense all at once; it doesn't all stick up here the first time; that's why we have our

Bibles and church and Bible Study and Sunday School, so we can help each other and build with each other. I know it's not always convenient, but God's Word is the Rock that is good for all times and good for all time. So I invite you and encourage you, don't settle for building on sand and excuses, build on the Rock of Jesus and you will be built right for life right with God. Amen.


CONFESSION & ABSOLUTION OF SINS
