1 Peter 2:4-10

Which is easier for you? To imagine our Father who art in heaven in the new world with a cell-phone loaded with pictures flipping through his pictures, showing off his pictures? Or to imagine our Father who art in heaven at home with the walls, and the bookcases, end tables, and refrigerator all decked out with pictures and more pictures? Picture your Father who art in heaven with his pictures. What does your Father keep pictures of? Fish, flowers, waterfalls, Rocky mountain majesty, Florida sunrises, California sunsets, castles and cathedrals? Nope, not unless you're in those pictures. His walls, his refrigerator, his phone are all filled with pictures of you, you with Jesus.

And as he looks at his pictures of you, what does he see? What does he remember about you? What does he say? With a great big smile, he says: "Mine!" He sees you connected with Jesus, covered with Jesus, walking and talking like Jesus, living and loving like Jesus. He sees you in your baptism pictures, your confirmation pictures, his family pictures. He sees how you stand with him. He sees you putting sin and Satan in their place. He sees what you do for him and his church; he sees you making him and his church look good. He sees you and remembers you as Champion, Winner, Saint, Ambassador - his Champion, his Winner, his Saint, his Ambassador to the world. And with you in his heart, he says: "You are my son, you are my daughter, whom I love; with you I am well-pleased."

We don't always feel that way; we don't always act that way, do we? This world sure doesn't treat us that way, does it? Sometimes we feel more like the people Peter was writing to. Like strangers and outsiders, we feel out of place. Because we're different with Jesus, because we live differently, because we live for Jesus instead of living the life of the world for our self, we don't fit in. Scattered, we might feel outnumbered and alone. And so, instead of feeling like Champion, Winner, Saint, Ambassador of the Living God, how often don't we feel beaten up and beaten down by the world? And perhaps more often, instead of living like Champion, Winner, Saint, Ambassador, we let ourselves get sucked in to the sin of our past and the empty life of the world around us.

So how can our Father who art in heaven have these pictures of us as Champion, Winner, Saint, Ambassador? How can he smile: "You are my son, you are my daughter, whom I love, with you I am well-pleased"? And when we are beaten up and beaten down, how can we see ourselves as Champion, Winner, Saint, Ambassador? When we feel out of place and alone, how can we see ourselves as God's special people with God's smile: "You're mine!" How? It's not by living the life of the world. And it's not by us living our best lives. The answer is in Jesus

Listen to what Peter says about Jesus. Peter doesn't picture Jesus as Shepherd; he does that in the next chapter. He doesn't picture Jesus as Redeemer; he did that in the chapter before. Here Peter pictures Jesus as Stone, a living, life-giving Stone. You know how people hunt to get just the right stone with just

the right look - the right stone for their ring, the right stone for their landscaping, the right stone for their kitchen counter or their fireplace. God chose Jesus as just the right stone for his house, his church.

And not just for looks. God chose Jesus to be the cornerstone. Today a cornerstone doesn't mean much, doesn't do much; it might be inscribed with the date the building was built; it might be hollowed out with a time capsule inside; it might be the last stone set in the building with a special ceremony. In the ancient world, the cornerstone would be the most important stone, specially measured, specially cut, specially placed in just the right way to set the direction for the rest of the building. If the cornerstone was off, the rest of the building would be off. If the cornerstone was right, the rest of the building could be set right. God chose Jesus to be the cornerstone of his church.

But God's people - some took a look at Jesus and didn't like what they saw; some listened and didn't like what Jesus said. They rejected Jesus, not only as cornerstone, but as any stone in their lives. Why? Jesus got in their way. As people of the world, we like to be our own judge, our own boss; we like to live for our self. And if or when or because Jesus says otherwise, he gets tossed off to the side as an old stone that's broken and good for nothing.

But God chose Jesus, and just because somebody doesn't want Jesus, that doesn't mean that they can rid themselves of Jesus. No matter how far they try to toss Jesus off, Jesus still stands in the way, if not as Savior and Shepherd, then as Judge.

For those who won't have Jesus as cornerstone, Jesus becomes the stone on which they stumble, the stone on which they fall into ruin.

But that's not you. You don't want that to be you, do you? You've tasted the hurt, the heartache, the bitterness of life in this world. And, as Peter says, you have tasted that the LORD is good. You know how good it is to see Jesus and his cross, Jesus and his empty Easter tomb; you know how good it is to hear Jesus say: "I forgive you." You know how good it is to see Jesus heal the sick, and feed the 5000, and drive out demons; and you know how good it is to hear Jesus say: "I've got you." You know how good it is to see Jesus with his pictures of heaven, and to hear Jesus say: "I have a home for you with me in heaven." And you know how good it is to hear Jesus invite you: "Come to me. Walk with me. Live with me. Work with me, and see if I don't bless you with more than all the world." Yes, with Jesus, "you have tasted that the Lord is good."

And now, Peter says, as you come to Jesus for more of Jesus, what does God do? Instead of looking at us and seeing us as broken and cracked and tossing us off, he sets you with Jesus. He chose and set Jesus as the cornerstone of his church, and now he chooses you and sets you as living stones on the cornerstone. Sometimes I like being a stone, sitting silent, not doing anything. But God has so much more for us in this life than just being stones. As he sets us with Jesus, he makes to be his holy priesthood. We could talk about how, out of all the people, in the world, we get direct access to God. We could talk about how we get to share the treasures of heaven with the people in our lives.

Peter talks about how we get to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Christ Jesus. What? We get to be part of God's inner circle, working with God, living the God-Lived Life, with God smiling on what we do for him with Jesus.

This past week I heard people on the front end of life stressing about what to do with their life. I heard people on the back end of life stressing about what to do with their life. I heard people on the front end of life, the back end of life and in the middle of life stressing: "What am I supposed to do? Whatever I do is never good enough." They want to do something worthwhile, something with meaning; and - instead of never being good enough - they want to know peace. Sound familiar? When we remember who we are - the people of God; when we remember why we are - to show and tell the greatness and grace of God; what we do for God doesn't need to have us stressing; what we do for God with Jesus has God smiling on you. Amen.
