John 1:29 The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him and said,
“Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!”

1 Peter 5:8 Be self-controlled and alert. Your enemy the devil prowls
around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour.

The Fifth Commandment: You shall not murder.
What does this mean?

or harm our neighbor in his body, but help and
befriend him in every bodily need.

Romans 6:23 For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life
in Christ Jesus our Lord.

The Third Commandment: Remember the Sabbath Day by keeping it holy.
What does this mean?
We should fear and love God that we do not
despise preaching and his Word, but regard it as
holy and gladly hear and learn it.

Romans 10:17 Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the
message is heard through the word of Christ.

Matthew 11:28 Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will
give you rest.

John 14:19 Before long, the world will not see me anymore, but you will
see me. Because I live, you also will live.

- Ephesians 4:32 Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.
- Proverbs 3:5-6 Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight.
- Psalms 50:15 And call on me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you, and you will honor me.
- 1 John 1:7 But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.
- Matthew 22:37-39 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'
- Psalms 139:14 I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well.
- Galatians 4:4-5 But when the time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under law, to redeem those under law, that we might receive the full rights of sons.
- Luke 2:10 But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people."
- Psalms 103:1-2 Praise the Lord, my soul; all my inmost being, praise his holy name. Praise the Lord, my soul, and forget not all his benefits.

2 Timothy 3:16-17 All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

Ephesians 2:8-9 For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast.

John 11:25 Jesus said to her, “I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die.”

Mark 10:45 For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.

The 1st Article of the Apostles Creed:

Matthew 6:33 But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

What does this mean?

We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things.

Matthew 26:41 Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the body is weak.

John 3:16 For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.

The 2nd Article of the Apostles Creed:

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Job 19:25 I know that my redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand on the earth.

The 3rd Article of the Apostles Creed:

I believe in the Holy Spirit; the holy Christian church; the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting. Amen.

The Second Commandment: You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God that we do not use his name to curse, swear, lie or deceive or use witchcraft, but call upon God's name in every trouble, pray, praise and give thanks.

Matthew 28:19-20 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.

Matthew 18:19-20 For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them.

Romans 1:16 For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes: first to the Jew, then to the Gentile.

Isaiah 41:10 So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.

1 Timothy 2:3-4 This is good, and pleases God our Savior, who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth.
