New Year's 2023

Luke 2:21

Today Jesus would be 8 days old. What does an 8-day-old do? If I remember right, an 8-day-old sleeps and suckles, cries and coos, spits up on top, messes up down below, and, with the right kind of help, burps. I imagine that on day 8, Jesus, yes, God-in-a -body Jesus, did all those same things, like most any other 8-day-old. But on that day 8 Jesus was also doing something more - he was living as Jesus.

Our lesson starts with Jesus, day 8. Following tradition, on day 8 Mary and Joseph named their baby. Following the word of Gabriel, Mary and Joseph named their baby: Jesus. Why Jesus? Some 9 months earlier Gabriel had appeared to Mary telling her she would have a son, telling her: "you are to give him the name Jesus," telling her that her son would be the Son of God, that he would take over for David, ruling a "kingdom that would never end."

Mary knew what that meant. Before Jesus was born, Mary sang a song about him. God was coming to save his people. Into her cold, cruel world - think of roman occupation forces forcing their way on the people ... think of the rich and powerful, the haves having their way stepping on the have-not poor ... think of the faithless flaunting their wicked worldliness in the faces of the faithful ... into that cold, cruel world God was coming to show mercy and to make life right for his people.

Some time later, after Gabriel had appeared to Mary, an angel appeared to Joseph, telling Joseph about Mary and the child she would have, telling him: "you are to give him the name Jesus." Why? "Because he will save his people from their sins."

I love to hear what Gabriel told Mary and what Gabriel's Jesus promise meant for Mary - that God has seen ... that God sees ... what this cold, hard world is doing to his people, and that God our Savior will step in, he will keep his promise, he will save and make life right for his people. I love to hear that when I see the world step on God's people. I love to hear that when I see our world's godless culture war against the godly. I love to hear that God will make life right for his people when the checkbook won't balance, when I can't make things right for people, when I see what sickness and death do. I love to hear that Jesus will establish a kingdom, that he will make life right for the people of God.

I love to hear that but what I really need to hear is what the angel told Joseph - "You are to give him the name Jesus because he will save his people from their sins." It's not just that world out there that I need to be saved from. It's from my sin in here that I need to be saved. I need a Savior to do more than make my life and my world right, I need a Savior to make me right, to set me right with God.

That's what Jesus was doing on day 8. On day 8 when Jesus was named, Jesus was also circumcised. Earlier we heard, "When the time was right, God sent his son, born of a

woman, born under law, to redeem those under law ...." On day 8 Jesus was living under the law; on day 8 God in Jesus subjected himself to the knife of the law, putting himself under law to fulfill the law in its every detail for you and for me. On day 8, in Jesus' circumcision, we see a snippet of Jesus' perfect obedience - a perfect obedience that led to Jesus' blood being shed to wash your sin away - you are forgiven! On that day we see a snippet of the perfect obedience we get to wear before God - with Jesus you are right by God!

And on day 8, we see something more. We see God put his name and promise on Jesus. Jesus wouldn't have to enter life and face the world on his own; Jesus wouldn't have to face sin and Satan on his own: Jesus wouldn't have to face his life's work on his own; Jesus wouldn't have to face death on his own. On day 8, God put his name and promise on Jesus. What's your favorite Old Testament promise? For some of you, it's Isaiah 41:10: "**Do** not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." On day 8, in circumcision, God gave that promise to Jesus. Perhaps you think of Jeremiah 29:11 - "I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans to give you peace, not disaster, plans to give you hope and a future." Or Isaiah 40: "Comfort, comfort my people ... speak tenderly to them ... tell them her sins have been paid for." On day 8, in giving his Son the name Jesus, God promised Jesus that he Jesus would make those promises come true for you.

What does that mean for us on this New Year's Day? Well, what does New Year's mean for you? For some people

New Year's means parties. For some people New Year's means loneliness, coldness, darkness, or emptiness because Christmas didn't fix things for them. For me this time of year is hard because I see my to-do lists - lists of the things I didn't get done this past year, lists of the people I didn't pastor right this past year, lists that just get longer each year. To answer that sense of failure, that emptiness, that loneliness, coldness, darkness ...; to give us something better than a party to mark time, to give us something better than a new calendar to refresh and renew us with all of its to-do's, Jesus gave us day 8.

With day 8 we have the best part of New Year's. How so? The best part of a New Year's Eve isn't being able to claim another year; the best part is being able to hear Jesus, God in Jesus, say "My body for you, my blood for you; my forgiveness, my peace for you; my life, my promise, my heaven all for you!" With day 8 we get to close out the old year at peace with God and at peace with ourselves. We get to know that the most important to-do's are done, taken care of - with Jesus, you have been set right with God, and that means, with Jesus, at some time, at God's right time, God will set life right for you. That's right, day 8 sets us up to look forward. We get to look forward knowing that this year Jesus will live up to his name. This year, we have Jesus to hold us with all the promises of God.

When I first typed that into my computer, I'll tell you, I didn't feel my face relax with a snap; my face was still tight and ready to snap. Until I asked myself: "what does this mean for

you?" If you're coming off a hard year, and heading into another, and you can feel it ... think about Jesus on day 8 - what does that name Jesus Savior mean for you? What does Jesus under the knife, on the cross, alive and ruling at God's right hand mean for you? Think about it: With Jesus, you have been set right with God, and that means, with Jesus, at some time, at God's right time, God will set life right for you. That's his promise! Amen.

In fact, you are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus. Indeed, as many of you as were baptized into Christ have been clothed with Christ. There is not Jew or Greek, slave or free, male or female, for you are all one and the same in Christ Jesus. And if you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's descendants and heirs according to the promise. ...

But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son to be born of a woman, so that he would be born under the law, in order to redeem those under the law, so that we would be adopted as sons. And because you are sons, God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts to shout, "Abba, Father!" So you are no longer a slave, but a son. And if you are a son, then you are also an heir of God through Christ.

#### GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

GOSPEL Luke 2:21–40

On the eighth day, when it was time to circumcise the child, he was named Jesus, the name the angel had given him before he was conceived.

When the time came for the purification rites required by the Law of Moses, Joseph and Mary took him to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord (as it is written in the Law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male is to be consecrated to the Lord"), and to offer a sacrifice in keeping with what is said in the Law of the Lord: "a pair of doves or two young pigeons."

Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. Moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying:

"Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you may now dismiss your servant in peace. For my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of all nations: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of your people Israel."

The child's father and mother marveled at what was said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to Mary, his mother: "This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against, so that the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your own soul too."

There was also a prophet, Anna, the daughter of Penuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was very old; she had lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, and then was a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshiped night and day, fasting and praying. Coming up to them at that very moment, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem.

When Joseph and Mary had done everything required by the Law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee to their own town of Nazareth. And the child grew and became strong; he was filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was on him.

#### NICENE CREED
