Sermon followed by Service

January 2, 2022 Titus 3:4-7

I don't know about you, but my timing is all off. I'm not talking about my dance timing - never had it, never will. I'm not talking about my stock market timing - never had it, never will. I'm talking more about my timing in here and in here [my heart and mind]. I can't blame it on COVID, but after one year, 9 months, how many weeks of COVID, I feel like my timing - in here and in here [my heart and my mind] - is all off. I seem to be spinning in a cycle of false starts and slow starts and worse starts.

First, the false starts. I remember back in late spring 2020 - eight to ten weeks after COVID started - I asked Dr. Tim if we could be starting up, back to normal, in early fall 2020. False start. Then, late fall 2020, our *Welcome Home* worship series, another false start. I don't remember how many service folders we printed for that Sunday; we didn't use them all, not by a long shot. Before then, since then, I don't know how many more starts I planned, thinking we'd be ready for a full start, only to trip and slip into another false start.

That's not the only way my timing is off. Sometimes I find myself wearing my mask when no one else is here in the whole building. And other times I find myself talking with someone, face to mask, my face to their mask, talking with someone who is taking care of their frail, aging parent, and they are being so careful not to get mom or dad sick. I don't need to judge them fearful - I find so many more people being careful for others than fearful for self. Other times I find myself talking with someone, face to mask, my face to their mask, talking with someone whose heart is heavy - maybe even a bit prickly - because every week they're getting an earful, a hurting-heartful, from a loved one working in a hospital, a loved one feeling crushed by all the COVID cases they're caring for. Nobody has gotten in my face yet, but I hear about the looks. And I have to admit - another false start on my part.

It's not just false starts that show my timing is off. I have the slow starts. The slow starts checking in on that dear family with the health issues, the slow starts checking in on that dear family who seems to be able to go and do whatever, wherever, except for anything at church. Add to that, slow starts in helping you check in on those families who are so dear to our Jesus. And it's not just me with the slow starts, is it? Not just me with the slow starts in doing what God has given

us to do. Why the slow starts? Oh, we have our reasons, don't we? We're being careful - careful not to share COVID, careful not to judge. Or we're so tired and busy - tired and busy, why? Would God say I have good reasons? Or would God say I have lousy excuses? How about you? What would God say is behind your slow starts?

False starts, slow starts. There's something worse, isn't there? And that's the no starts. Maybe we feel jerked around; maybe we feel judged; maybe we feel forgotten - and we're not moving, we're not budging, we're just going to plant ourselves until who knows what. Or maybe we just feel stuck. Planted in the "no start" position. Stuck in the "no start" position. Content in the "no start" position. It can feel good, like hypothermia can feel good before slipping away. Being content in the "no start" position can be a hypothermia of the soul, that slips into a coma of the soul, that slips into death of the soul.

Where do you see false starts, slow starts and no starts in your life?

I don't know about you, but with all my false starts, slow starts, and no starts, I need a new start. A new start bigger and better than a new calendar, a new year. A new start into a life with no false starts, slow starts, or no starts. A new start into a life with no COVID or cancer. A new start into a life with no hurt or heartache. A new start into a life where we never have to bite our tongue or kick our self or wish we could start all over. A new start into a life of perfect timing where every step we take is the right step at the right time, where every move we make is the right move at the right time. Today our Lord gives us that new start. Sounds good, doesn't it?

When do we get that new life?

So how? How does our Lord give us that new start? In baptism. In the water and Word of baptism, God works in us a rebirth and renewal. In the water and Word of baptism, the Holy Spirit makes us new. New and alive as the children of God. New and alive, connected with Jesus inside us. New and alive, with the Holy Spirit powering us. New and alive, with the Father himself making his home with us!

New and alive as the children of God, we aren't children of false starts, slows starts, and no starts; we may have them, but we are children alive and new with God, alive with a new life in us and a new life ahead of us. New and alive as the

children of God, we aren't children of COVID and cancer; we may get them, but we are children of God with healing in us and healing ahead of us. New and alive as the children of God, we aren't children doomed to a life of hurt and heartache; our hearts may hurt and ache, but we are children with God living a life of healing and hope with heaven ahead of us. New and alive as the children of God, we aren't children who will be forever biting our tongues and forever kicking our backsides; we still step in it now and then, but we are children of God, alive with the Spirit working God's love in us, alive with the Spirit working God's love through us.

We might think, I'm not seeing that. First, let me tell you what God sees. He sees Jesus. No false starts in his life; no slow starts in his life; no "no starts" in his life. From heaven to earth, when the time was right, when God said: "Let's go; let's do this," from heaven to earth, Jesus did what God gave him to do, and lived the life God gave him to live. Baptized with water and the Spirit, Jesus didn't slow start or no start. He took on the life God had for him; he took on the battles God had for him. Baptism didn't make life easy for Jesus; in fact, Jesus was baptized for battle. But in baptism God set Jesus up to fight and to win the battles that were ahead of him. Baptized with water and the Spirit, Jesus wasn't on his own, but Jesus had new power to live the life God had for him. Living as a baptized child of God, Jesus didn't let the evil of the world didn't trip him, trap him, stop him; living as a baptized child of God, Jesus didn't let the blessings of the world didn't trip him, trap him, distract him. Not even the curse of the cross with your sin and my sin could stop him. You remember Jesus on the cross - "it is finished." And you remember Jesus on Easter - alive and well - no false starts, no slow starts, no "no starts." From heaven to earth and back to heaven again, the Father sees Jesus starting and finishing what he came to do.

Now, in baptism, God sees you. He sees your false starts, slow starts and no starts washed away - forgiven. He sees you covered over with the perfect life of Jesus. He sees you spotless, blameless, radiant, right for life with God himself.

When is that good for? Not just the moment of our baptism, but for life. When false starts have you feeling foolish, guilty, remember your baptism. When slow starts have you feeling sluggish and slow, remember your baptism. When "no starts" have you feeling stuck and content in your stuckedness, remember your baptism. Washed by water and the Word, you are made new and alive, washed and forgiven for life with God.

What does that mean for us? Some day, when the timing is right, we'll get to fit into the new life God has for us in heaven. It will be so good to live that new life with you in heaven. But first, we get to fit into the timing and new life God has for us here - a life of new starts, new starts today, new starts every day. It's good to start the new year with you; it's good to start a new life with you. In this new year, may God bless you with his new start timing! Amen.


GATHERING RITE ON HOLY BAPTISM

IN OUR WORLD TODAY ... we have been enduring false starts and slow starts to the point that we might feel stuck in a no-start rut.


IN OUR WORSHIP TODAY ... we get to power up with the new start our Lord works in Baptism - every day, we get to live a new life with the power and promise of our Lord!

INVOCATION


- P: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

- C: But we were washed, we were sanctified, we were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God. (1 Corinthians 6:11)




- P: As baptized children of God, we confess our sins.

SECOND READING Romans 6:4-13

We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.

If we have been united with him like this in his death, we will certainly also be united with him in his resurrection. For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves to sin - because anyone who has died has been freed from sin.

Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. For we know that since Christ was raised from the dead, he cannot die again; death no longer has mastery over him. The death he died, he died to sin once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God.

In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus. Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its evil desires. Do not offer the parts of your body to sin, as instruments of wickedness, but rather offer yourselves to God, as those who have been brought from death to life; and offer the parts of your body to him as instruments of righteousness.


PRAYER OF THE CHURCH






