# Sermon followed by Service

January 22, 2023 1 Kings 3

"Whatever ... whatever you want ... whatever you ask for is yours!" What do you say to an offer like that? We know what Solomon said. Solomon could have asked for riches and power ... he could have asked for glory and honor ... he could have asked for an "easy button" with servants and angels to do whatever he wanted ... Solomon could have asked for a life-long vacation ... but he didn't ask for any of that. In fact, he really didn't ask for anything for himself. Listen to Solomon's answer: "You have shown great kindness to your servant, my father David .... Now, O LORD my God, you have made your servant king in place of my father David. But I am only a little child and do not know how to carry out my duties. ... So give your servant a discerning heart to govern your people and to distinguish between right and wrong. For who is able to govern this great people of yours?" Instead of thinking "Wow! ME! ME!" Solomon's heart looked up: "God, you are so kind and gracious!" Instead of just: "What's in this for me?" Solomon's heart looked out for God's people. So, Solomon asked for a "discerning heart." A heart to figure out right and wrong, a heart wise to govern God's people. When Solomon heard God's offer: "Whatever you want ..." Solomon didn't just think: "what's in it for me?" He thought of God and God's people and what he needed to serve them right.

"Whatever you want." When God opens the doors of his treasure-house for us inviting "Ask whatever you want ..." what

do you reach for first? What the world calls treasure? Or what God calls treasure? What the world sees as power? Or what God sees as power? What the world sees as wisdom? Or what God says is wise? Do we go first for what God calls first and best? Or do we fill up on dessert or worse, and then wonder why our insides ache?

Solomon didn't always have his priorities right. He let himself get distracted by his work, his family and friends, his fun. He let himself get distracted by the devil and it almost destroyed him. Solomon let his time and his heart get filled with the treasures of the world - sure, most of it good, but some not so good - and Solomon let God get squeezed out. Sound familiar?

Here's a question - Am I being fair to Solomon? I'm not, am I? Solomon wasn't some helpless victim of time and temptation. Solomon wasn't a helpless, witless victim who didn't know any better. Solomon didn't just let his heart and mind get distracted by temptation and the treasure of the world. Solomon turned his heart from the treasure of God to the treasure of the world; he chose the devil's temptation over God's treasure. And it cost him. Solomon lost his kingdom for his children and he nearly lost his soul.

That's what is at stake for us. On Lutheran School Sunday, with the God-lived Life, we're not just recruiting to raise up Bible experts and if that's not for you - if you don't have the time, if Bible Study just doesn't interest you - you can take it or leave it. For a long time Solomon left it and it almost cost him his soul. By God's grace, Solomon saw that no matter how much stuff he had, he was missing something. And by God's grace

Solomon realized what he was missing - Solomon was missing God as first. In his heart and mind, he had filled that first place that belonged to God with this and that.

But God didn't give up on Solomon. God wanted to be there for Solomon, and praise God, he wants to be there, first in our hearts, for us. That's why he gave us his Word, not just these words on paper, but Jesus His Word in the flesh. You remember Jesus the 12 year old boy at the Temple - God himself, asking questions, looking to learn, setting God and the wisdom of God first in his heart. You remember Jesus on the cross - obeying His Father's Word, shouting his own Word - "It is Finished!" Having to pay ... having to obey to be right with God - it's all finished. Jesus did it all for you. That's the wisdom of God that sets you right with God, the wisdom that says: "You are forgiven," the wisdom that makes you alive with the heart and the power of God, the wisdom that opens for you the home of God, heaven for you.

Today when God opens his treasure store: "Ask whatever you wish ..." don't get suckered by the treasures and priorities of the world; don't leave God's greatest treasures - his wisdom, his power, his heart - on the shelf. Don't settle for the wisdom of the world, let God show you what he knows. Don't settle for the power of the world; plug into the power of God. Don't settle for the heart of \_\_\_\_\_ whoever is singing the love songs today; let God fill your heart with his love. Don't settle for the justice of People's Court, Divorce Court, Judge Judy, or Jerry Springer; be part of the justice that God works for his people.

How? Let God reward you with his wisdom. It's a great thing to learn the wonders of science and the lessons of history. Here at school it's not just science - we get to learn the wonders of God's creation and see what an awesome God we have. Here it's not just history; it's his story - the history of God's grace, God working history to bless his people. Here in our school, even after our morning Bible lesson, we and our students get to soak throughout the day, not just in the smarts of the world, but in the wisdom of God - his love and grace.

Today, in our classrooms, we'll get to see the wisdom that God is sharing with our children. And starting next Sunday, in Family Bible Hour, we'll get see and review what God says to us in his Bible. We'll start at the foundations and see what God has for us. We might think we know it all already; we might think we don't have time. But God will share his wisdom with us and tell us his secrets, the secrets and the wisdom of heaven.

I asked one of our fellas what he thought of the Bible Information Class we're starting next week. He said: "I think everyone should take it. So many of the questions that I hear from people are answered in that class. And even if we think we already know it all, no matter how much we think we know, God has more for us." That sounds like an answer Peter would give. It sounds like something Solomon would say. Even better, it sounds like something Jesus would say - "Come to me, learn from me, listen to me and be filled with the treasures of heaven."

Today, this year, here in his word, in church and in school, in Sunday School and Bible Class, God is offering to bless you. We invite you to the blessing of God! Amen.

You are a great and a wondrous God, cupping in your hands all the depths of earth. You made the hills and the mountains high, you made the seas and the dry land.


Come, let us worship and, bowing low, kneel before the One who has made us all. You are the God whom we call our own, we are the flock that you shepherd.

# FIRST READING

1 Kings 3:5–12, 4:29–34

At Gibeon the LORD appeared to Solomon during the night in a dream, and God said, "Ask for whatever you want me to give you."

Solomon answered, "You have shown great kindness to your servant, my father David, because he was faithful to you and righteous and upright in heart. You have continued this great kindness to him and have given him a son to sit on his throne this very day.

"Now, LORD my God, you have made your servant king in place of my father David. But I am only a little child and do not know how to carry out my duties. Your servant is here among the people you have chosen, a great people, too numerous to count or number. So give your servant a discerning heart to govern your people and to distinguish between right and wrong. For who is able to govern this great people of yours?"

The Lord was pleased that Solomon had asked for this. So God said to him, "Since you have asked for this and not for long life or wealth for yourself, nor have asked for the death of your enemies but for discernment in administering justice, I will do what you have asked. I will give you a wise and discerning heart, so that there will never have been anyone like you, nor will there ever be. ...

God gave Solomon wisdom and very great insight, and a breadth of understanding as measureless as the sand on the seashore. Solomon's wisdom was greater than the wisdom of all the people of the East, and greater than all the wisdom of Egypt. He was wiser than anyone else, including Ethan the Ezrahite—wiser than Heman, Kalkol and Darda, the sons of Mahol. And his fame spread to all the surrounding nations. He spoke three thousand proverbs and his songs numbered a thousand and five. He spoke about plant life, from the cedar of Lebanon to the hyssop that grows out of walls.

He also spoke about animals and birds, reptiles and fish. From all nations people came to listen to Solomon's wisdom, sent by all the kings of the world, who had heard of his wisdom.
