Almost nobody got to see it. Gold. Gold from the world around. Not just grams or ounces or even pounds, but tons of gold; today, billions of dollars of gold. The inside walls, the floor, the ceiling glistening, covered in gold. A sight to see; a sight to behold. But who got to see it? Almost nobody, but God and a few of his priests.

So why? When David made plans for the temple, when Solomon built the temple, when they gave for the building of the temple, they had in their hearts and minds the goodness and grace, the greatness and glory of God. For David and for Solomon, that's what the God-Lived Life was about - "Oh, give thanks to the Lord, for he is good!" - soaking in the goodness and grace, the greatness, and glory of God. So for David and Solomon, the God-Lived Life meant nothing but the best for God and his Temple - even if nobody but God saw it.

Today we hear something even better than gold. Even better than the shining glory of God, we get to see the heart of God.

Solomon has the temple built, its main room, the Holy Place, about the size of our nave, a little narrower, a lot taller - 60 feet long, by 30 wide by 45 high; its walls carved with pomegranates, palm trees, and flowers, then covered with gold. Its primary room - the Holy of Holies, the Most Holy Place, a perfect cube 30 feet by 30 by 30, God's perfect golden throne room with the ark of the covenant covered with gold, with two

golden cherubim, their wings spread out touching wall to wall. For David and Solomon, the God-Lived Life meant nothing but the best for God and his Temple - even if almost nobody but God saw it.

So Solomon has the temple built as a home for God among his people. Then Solomon calls the elders of his people together to dedicate the temple; they don't get to enter the main rooms of God's house; they gather outside in the courtyards in front of the temple. Solomon has the ark of the covenant brought into the temple, and then - in a cloud - the LORD enters. And Solomon, kneeling on his knees, hands raised up to heaven, prays a prayer even better than gold.

Solomon shows he knows God doesn't need a house, a temple, here on earth; he's too great and glorious to be confined by a building; he has all of heaven as his home. Solomon shows he knows it's God's people who need a house for God - a place to draw them in and draw them together with God and his people - a place to give them a taste of the greatness of God - a place to center his people with God. Solomon sees God's Temple as a place for God's people to look to God, to gather and be together with God. Read Solomon's prayer and you will see that Solomon sees the God-Lived Life as this - when life is good, when life is hard, God's people look to the temple to look to God, God's people gather at the temple to be with God. Why? When we do that, good things happen! We train ourselves, and we show the world, to leave the life of the world behind, to look to God and to gather with God.

Basking in the glory and worship of God, Solomon wasn't under any illusions that the holiness of the moment would last. He knew his people; he knew himself. He knew the sin of his people, how they were so easily distracted away from the God-Lived Life. I wonder if Solomon recognized how he himself was already being distracted away from the God-Lived Life. So what's a theme running through Solomon's prayer? "O LORD, forgive." Solomon sees us distracted from God, distracted by the evil of the world, distracted by the good life. And we are so easily distracted, so easily filled with excuses to ease up on the God-Lived Life, aren't we? Not just when life is good, but when life is hard, it's so easy to forget God, blame God, turn away and even against God. And then what Solomon sees explains so much in our world today. What does Solomon see God doing? With COVID, with the flu, with the economy, with our broken bodies and broken world, Solomon sees God nudging, squeezing, stopping us up short, so that we heed his call and invitation, that we turn back, come back, and pray with Solomon: "O LORD, forgive; God, have mercy."

As Solomon is on his knees, hands raised to the heavens, praying, God hears more than Solomon; he hears another sound in the air - the sounds of cattle and sheep and goats, cattle and sheep and goats that would be sacrificed, some sacrificed to cover over the sin and guilt of his people, some sacrificed to celebrate with a meal life with God, yes, to celebrate the God-Lived life. Know this, as you pray, God also hears another Lamb sound, the voice of his Son, the Lamb of God. By his sacrifice on the cross, he has taken your sin and covered your guilt. Today as you pray, the Father in heaven hears the voice of his Son at his

side speaking up for you: "He's forgiven; she's right by you; they're with us!" And so the Father and his Son hear you and see you forgiven and right by him. They see you precious, more precious than gold, more precious than all the gold in the world. How so? They see you and hear you as their family to love and care for today and forever.

And that's not all. You heard what Paul said in Ephesians. It explains why you're here. God is building for himself a new temple, a new home for himself. This temple that God is building - it's not a temple built by hands or built out of stones or wood or even gold - it's built with you. God himself is here gathering you together, joining you together, building you together to be his holy temple with the Holy Spirit living in you. I should say "us." God isn't looking to build each of us to be mini, individual temples; God is gathering us together, joining us together, building us together to be his temple together. Why? God sees together as better! Together is better for the work he has for us. Together, together with him and together with each other is better!

This temple that God is building us into isn't built on a consensus of the people; it's not joined together by a spiritual feeling. Sometimes we hear people: "I don't believe in any particular religion; I'm just spiritual." It's no wonder, is it? With all the ways we've shamed God's church, it's no wonder people want to steer clear. Sometimes we hear people say that the church would be stronger if we would just learn to agree with each other and accept each other no matter what we believe and

teach. That can sound so good, and it would sound good to God if we would all learn to agree with him. But Satan can get people to agree to all sorts of nonsense; so, no, God isn't building his church on our agreement with each other. God is building his church on the foundation of the apostles and prophets; God is building his church with Jesus as the cornerstone. That's why we keep going back to the Bible, so that we are built together on God's foundation instead of human thinking. It's why - instead of settling for spiritual - we focus on the person, the Word and Work of Jesus as the Way, the Truth, and the Life.

Solomon built a temple lined with golden glory, gold that almost nobody could see. The temple that God is building - building with you - the temple that God is building has a glory better than gold, a glory that God wants to show off for everyone to see. By his Spirit, God is living in you - in us - to show off the glory of Jesus. To show the world how Jesus loves. To show the world the grace, the mercy, the peace that Jesus has for you and for them. That's what the God-Lived Life is about - every day we check and build on the foundation God has for us in the prophets and apostles. Every day we check ourselves and line up with Jesus. Every day we go to the Word and Sacrament to be filled with the Spirit. And what happens? Better than gold, God is building us together to show off the grace and glory of our God - the grace and glory that gathers hearts for heaven. Amen.




