Sermon followed by Service

October 2, 2022

Romans 5:1-5

I'm confused. What is America's favorite holiday? It's coming soon. Christmas with angels singing and our favorite songs: "Silent Night, holy night, all is calm" or "Peace came to earth," or a tiny bit louder "Joy to the World!" After Christmas, what are our favorite holidays? The days we say: "Thank you; I love you." So what's up with this month? Instead of days of peace and thanks and love, it seems we have a month of trying to creep each other out with darkness and death. We pray for peace, we claim to love, and then work to set each other on edge.

It's not just with Halloween, is it? Throughout the year, we pray for peace for our families, and then we do things and say things we know will ruin their peace. We pray for peace for ourselves, and then what? We do things and say things we know will ruin our peace. When it comes to peace, or lack of peace, we can be our own worst enemies.

So what's the answer? I have voices inside my head that tell me: "If life were easier, you wouldn't be so stressed; if you could sit back on your deck and enjoy your backyard paradise, ahhh, that would be peace." Or "If people would just do what you say, then you wouldn't have to work so hard; if people would just do what you say, then, ahhh, that would be peace." Or "If you just had a bit more money in the bank, then you wouldn't have to worry; if you just had more money, you could go out more, vacation more, relax more; if you just had more money, then, ahhh, that would be peace." In other words, "If I just had a bit more paradise, more power, more plenty, then I'd have peace." Ever fall into that trap?

Think about it. How did paradise, power, and plenty work out for Adam and Eve? They lived in the perfect paradise, the Garden of Eden, with nothing to worry about. They were in charge, empowered by God, with all the power of God to back them up. They had plenty, all they would need, all they could want. They had paradise, power, and plenty - everything they needed for peace, everything we might think we need for peace.

But what? We can be our own worst enemies. For Adam and Eve, their paradise, power, and plenty in the Garden wasn't good enough for them. The paradise, power, and plenty of God wasn't good enough for them. They thought they could do better without God. And when they went off without God, what happened to the peace they had? Their plenty wasn't enough and they had to cover themselves up. Their power wasn't enough and they had to hide from God. Their paradise was no longer a paradise. Where before Adam and Eve and God lived in perfect peace, now Adam and Eve were hiding from God, with Adam blaming Eve and God, and Eve blaming a snake. It takes something more than paradise, power, and plenty to have peace, doesn't it?

What does it take? Well, what was it that led to Adam and Eve's loss of peace, their guilty fear, their conflict with each other? It wasn't eating a piece of fruit. No, it was thinking they would be better off thinking their way than God's way, doing their thing than God's thing. So what, do you think, is the way back to peace? Some would say: "Think God's way and do God's thing. Be good and get on God's good side." Sounds good, but what? It's impossible for us. As children of Adam and Eve we are born sinners, programmed to fight against God, to argue against God, to think our way better than God's way. As children of Adam and Eve we are born into and under God's judgment. Now before we blame Adam and Eve and God, we

get to look in the mirror of God's law. Every day, by what we say and do, by the way we say "No!" to God, we prove we deserve God's judgment, not just a slap on the wrist but the fires of hell. And so we live in a world fighting against God and under God's judgment, a world where every day we choke on the smoke and dust and wonder: "Where's the peace?"

Where's the peace? Jesus. What did Paul say? "We have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." How is Jesus the key to peace? Some would say that Jesus is God's nice guy sent to win our hearts and show us how to be nice. No, we need more than a nice guy to get us to play nice before God. By law, we have a death sentence hanging over our head and playing nice won't fix that.

Paul tells us how Jesus is our peace. He takes us to God's courtroom. Imagine the evidence God has against you; imagine God's judgment - "the soul that sins, it shall die." Now imagine all that evidence God has against you, God puts it on Jesus; he puts it all on Jesus. And with the evidence, so goes the judgment. There on the cross, God cursed and crushed Jesus. You heard Jesus' anguish: "My God, my God, what have you forsaken me." And you know Jesus' peace: "It is finished." You know Jesus' peace: "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." You know Jesus' peace: "He was delivered over to death for our sins and was raised to life for our justification."

That's the verse right before our lesson. With Jesus, in God's courtroom, the evidence against you is gone. With Jesus, God's judgment against you has been vacated. With Jesus, God declares you "not guilty," even better, with Jesus, God sees you and calls you right. Right for what? I could say right for life with God. Paul says right for "access," access to God's grace, and so access to God.

What is it that's upsetting your peace? Is it the economy? With Jesus, you have access to God's grace and God's plenty. Is it people not doing what you want, life not going the way you want? With Jesus, you have access to God's grace and so to God's power. I'm not saying that with God's power you will be able to make everyone do what you want, and everything go the way you want. We have a better promise, with his power God will make all things - everything that feels out of control, everything that seems to be against us - God will make all things work for our good. You have access to God, his grace and power. And you have access to God and his paradise.

How did Paul put it? "We rejoice in the hope of the glory of God." How about that for peace? No matter what is going on out there - how did we sing it last week? - "I'm a child of paradise." No matter who is against me - "I'm a child of paradise." No matter how this bag of bones feels - "I'm a child of paradise." No matter how this insecure, anxious box of brains feels - "I'm a child of paradise." I've got a place with God; I've got peace with God.

Gives us a whole new way of looking at trouble, doesn't it? Instead of trouble unsettling us, setting us on-edge, instead of groaning or grumbling, instead of giving up, Paul says "We rejoice in our troubles." We rejoice in our troubles? How? With Jesus we know we have a place with God. With Jesus we know we have peace with God. And so with Jesus, we know that God must be doing something good with our troubles.

Like what? This is what Paul sees: "we rejoice in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope." Paul sees God using our troubles. I'm not sure how to put this into

words. God uses trouble to help us practice peace. Not just the kind of peace that comes from: "My belly is full, and my bed is soft," but the kind of peace that comes from: "No matter who might be against me, I've got God for me." "No matter what goes wrong, my God will make things work good for me." Sounds good, doesn't it? And what does that lead to? "No matter who is doing wrong around me or against me, I will show my God is good." "No matter how dark things look, I will shine with the light of God." And what does that lead to? "No matter what, I get to have hope; no matter what, I will show hope."

Hope. I want better than hope; I want the reality. And I don't think I'm alone in that, am I? But today we don't need to be disappointed by hope, disappointed we're "still stuck here." No, look at the love God has already poured out and into you - you have a place with God in the family of God, you have access to God and his grace, access to the plenty of God, access to the power of God, and, yes, some day, access to the paradise of God. So hope doesn't disappoint us. With all the love that God has already given us, our hope is guaranteed, and we get to live in peace. Amen.

THE SERVICE



SECOND READING Romans 5:1–10

Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we boast in the hope of the glory of God. Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.

You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through him! For if, while we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life!

NICENE CREED

O God our Father, hear our intercessions, answer them according to your will, and make us the channels of your infinite pity and helpfulness.



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Special Voters' Meeting Agenda Items

On Wednesday, October 12, at 7pm, the Voters' Assembly will meet to act on the following items of ministry and business:

- 1. Call for Principal / Staff Minister of Outreach The "Call Season" opens October 12, and we want to show that we're ready and eager to move forward.
- 2. Classroom Heating/Cooling Project Through a special COVID-relief grant, our classrooms and office now have new air-quality improving, air filtration, heating/cooling units. They are incredibly quiet and early results show that they are highly energy efficient. Due to increased costs and additional costs and work beyond the parameters of the grant, we have exceeded the grant we received for the project. Therefore, we ask that we add the entire project to the Classroom Renovation Project to allow for these costs, landscaping upgrades, and future wall repair and window-well capping costs. Funding for the Renovation project continues to be: Special Gifts, Match from Facility Improvement Fund, 2020-2021 Dr Office Transfer (\$30k), and finally "Overage" from Fiscal Year 2020-2021 (about \$44k after special gifts to WELS and Shoreland).
- 3. Kitchen Project Our Kitchen Renovation Committee is ready to move forward with the "Next Steps" they outlined for us on a recent Sunday. Therefore, we recommend that we authorize the Kitchen Renovation Committee to move forward with: 1) replacing the kitchen floor, 2) purchase and installation of a new range/oven, and 3) other lesser peripherals that may arise as they prepare project plans for MC and then Voter approval for a summer 2023 renovation project. Kitchen Renovation Committee members are Dale Villiard, Sheryl Linnemann, and Mark Hirons.

Lord's Supper Together Again!

This weekend, we are returning to communing together by "table" rather than by family. Ushers will invite ~5 people from each side (seeking to keep families together) to go forward up the center aisle to the front pew. From there, another usher will indicate when to go forward to fill in behind the "table" being served. As the "table" being served is dismissed and returns to their seats, the next "table" steps forward.

As we are being served, we stretch out an open hand to receive the body of our Lord given to us in, with, and under the bread. If you prefer a gluten-free wafer, please indicate so to Pastor (he won't mind a reminding wave). When your "table" has all received the bread, we will eat together as Pastor invites: "Take, eat." Then, as Jesus shares his blood in, with, and under the wine, please take a cup nearest to you. When your "table" has all received the wine, we will drink together as Pastor invites: "Take, drink." Then the pastor will bless you and dismiss you. As you go out toward whatever side you were sitting, you will find a basket for your empty communion cup. Then we return to our seats with smiles enjoying peace with our Lord and his people!

If you are at that point in life where steps and balance are a questionable challenge, please let Pastor know, sit toward the front, or (if you prefer) at the end of the line come and stand before a front pew - and we will come to serve you.
