Sermon followed by Service

October 23, 2022

Ephesians 1:3-14

Where's your best place for good ideas? I get some really good ideas in the shower, but by the time I dry off, they're usually poof and gone. Sometimes my shower ideas stack up and they fit together into genius plans - "this is going to work!" Sometimes I'm even able to get those ideas, that new master plan, out of the shower, and past the toilet. But when I try to put it all down on paper or into my computer, what happens? Those beautiful ideas and plans that stacked and fit so well in the shower - instead of fitting together, they crash and mash into each other and crumble. Not all of them. Sometimes my ideas and plans survive and turn into promises, promises that break.

Sound familiar? What's the answer? Some would say, "Longer showers." Others might say, "Forget the plans; you don't need plans; you don't have time for plans. Just do it; just wing it. If it doesn't work, so what? And if they don't like it, that's their problem." For some things, that can be the right answer. But is "So what? That's their problem" really the right answer, the loving answer, for "When I die, who will take care of my children, my family?" Is "So what? That's their problem" really the right answer for "When I die, what will happen to my money and stuff - will it go where I want it to go?" Some things are too important to blow off planning. Some things in life are too precious to trust to "So what? That's their problem."

My parents were planners. I remember when I was young, before school would start, Mom and Dad would take me and my three younger brothers shopping for school clothes. We went to the discount store and got shoes from the bottom shelf where they had cut off the labels. We got the jeans made out of polyester. So when Dad brought home that new Impala station wagon, I looked at it: "How in the world?" Dad must have seen my look; he said: "Mom's been saving money out of the checking account each month so we'd be ready when we needed this." Later in life, years before he died, Dad planned ahead and made sure to set Mom up in a good place with good neighbors so she wouldn't be alone when he died. Mom and Dad planned ahead. They planned ahead for each other; they planned ahead for their family; and they planned ahead for Jesus. You may remember me saying this. I don't remember how old I was; it was years and years ago. I was visiting home, and out of the blue, Mom dropped their estate plan on me. "We've always prayed, 'Come, Lord Jesus, be our guest.' We've always thought of Jesus as part of the family, and so that is we did with our will. We divided things up six ways; five parts for our five children, and one part for Jesus." Mom and Dad were planners.

Where did they get it from? I could say they got it from being smart, but being smart isn't what drove them. So why were they planners? They got it from God; they got it from the way God loves them with a plan; they got it from the way God loves us with a plan. And that's what drove them to have a plan, to take care and love with a plan.

We see God's plan in our lessons. From before all time - yea, he didn't wait until the last minute; he didn't wing it; it wasn't just some flash idea. From before all time God chose you. He chose you to be his. He chose you to know his love. He chose you to be holy and special like him, holy and special with him. And he didn't just leave it as an idea. He made it his plan. He turned it into a promise. And then he worked his plan. And shared his promise. He worked his plan leading up to Jesus. And he shared a string of promises pointing ahead to Jesus - the promise of a Champion to fight for us and crush Satan's head, the promise that God would bless the world through Abraham, the promise of a forever King in the line of David, the promise that "the virgin would conceive and give birth to a son." God didn't just have an idea; he didn't just wing it. He had a plan and he worked his plan and Jesus was born.

It wasn't always smooth and easy. Satan was always trying to distract God's people, tempt them and turn them off God's plan. Then when Jesus was born, Satan turned his sights on Jesus; he tried to distract Jesus; he tried to bully Jesus; he thought he could use the world to get rid of Jesus. But from Christmas to the cross, God worked his plan in Jesus, and after the cross, God kept his promise with Easter. Today Jesus lives, and the blood he shed on the cross covers over and forgives our sin. Today, Jesus lives, and the life he lived of sticking to God's plan, and working God's plan, and keeping God's promise - that life Jesus gives to you in baptism - so God sees you sticking to his plan, working his plan, living in his promise.

Yes, God sees you with Jesus. Not just by chance, not by accident, and not by some good idea or plan of our own. God sees you with Jesus today, because God saw you with Jesus long before time began. Because God saw you with Jesus long before time began, from long before you were born, God has been working his plan for you in this world, in your family tree, in good times and in tough times to turn evil to good. From before you were born, God has been working your history to bring you to the right time and the right place for the Holy Spirit to connect you to Jesus.

You aren't here by accident; you aren't here by chance; you aren't here because you had a good idea or a good plan. If it were up to you

and your good ideas, if it were up to me and my good plans, we would all be damned. But we are here, you are here because God has been working history, his story, your story, to connect your story to his story - so you can live in his Jesus promise - "God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." Everlasting life - back before time began, when God saw you with Jesus, he didn't just see you with Jesus here in this life. God saw you with Jesus in heaven living and enjoying life the way it's supposed to be. That's the plan God is working; that's the promise God is keeping.

God has been working that plan from before the creation of the world. He's been keeping his promise for nearly as long. Keeping his Jesus promise to Adam and Eve, Abraham and Sarah, Moses, David and Bathsheba, and countless more. At the same time, working his Jesus promise through Adam and Eve, Abraham and Sarah, Moses, David and Bathsheba, and countless more. And now? Now God is keeping his promise, his Jesus promise to you and me. And he is working his Jesus promise through you and me.

That's right. God isn't just working his Jesus promise for us, God is working his Jesus promise through us. Through you to the family he gives you. Through you to friends and neighbors he brings into your life. Though you, God is working to connect and reconnect people with Jesus. Through you, God is working to keep people connected with Jesus. Through you - yes, God is including you in working his plan and keeping his promise so that people you know and people you don't yet know - so you can see them like he sees them - alive with Jesus in heaven.

God's not winging it; he's not making it up as he goes along; he's not leaving it for someone else to deal with. He's not thinking: "Too much time, too much work to figure this out." He sees you as worth it; he sees keeping his promise to you as worth it; he sees working with you as worth it - worth his planning and worth his working.

That's why we plan and work our plan with Jesus. That's why we plan our weeks to be here with Jesus. That's why we plan our finances to work here with Jesus. That's why we plan our days to have time to listen and talk with Jesus. Yes, that's why we take the time to think, really think, about what we want to do with Jesus. Sure, some of our idea will poof and be gone. And some of our plans will smash and crash. And some of our promises will break. But that doesn't stop us. It's not stopping God from keeping his promise to us; it's not stopping God from looking to work his promise through us. Why? He's a planner, and he's got a plan for you with Jesus! Amen.

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Conference of Presidents holds its fall 2022 meeting

The Conference of Presidents (COP) met for its fall meeting October 4-7. The COP welcomed two new members, Rev. Daniel Leyrer, president of our Southeastern Wisconsin District, and Rev. Michael Seifert (Sarah Lofsness' brother), president of the North Atlantic District.

As a part of its meeting, Rev. James Pope was installed as the new executive editor of *Forward in Christ*. Pope succeeds Rev. John Braun, who is retiring after 15 years in the position.

The COP approved a recommendation to shift the responsibilities of deferred giving counselor Scott Wagner from another district to our Southeastern Wisconsin District. Mr. Wagner has agreed to this change.

Currently there are **155 vacancies** in pastoral positions, 141 of those in parishes. The remaining positions are in retirement calls (two), foreign mission positions (three), professor positions (five), and other pastorally trained positions (four).

The COP determined a mechanism will be put in place to gather suggestions and questions regarding the restatement on the roles of men and women. A decision will be made later as to whether the statement will be submitted to the 2023 synod convention or whether additional study is beneficial.

The COP heard an initial report from the task force studying **teacher shortages**. That <u>task force</u> will continue its work. Mr. Jim Rademan, director of the Commission on Lutheran Schools, also provided an update on the development of a new K-12 religion curriculum.

Home Missions provided an update on the 100 missions in 10 years effort that will begin in 2023.

World Missions also provided updates on our work in India, Africa, Hong Kong, Thailand, and London. World Missions continues to be the conduit for ongoing relief efforts in **Ukraine**.

The COP asked me [WELS President] to appoint a task force to study ways to identify alternatives to Title IV funding (federal student loans and grants) and to explore possible ways to increase financial assistance to students preparing for ministry.

The recommendations are intended to be placed before the synod convention in 2023. [The Equality Act before Congress could threaten student aid for our students.]

The COP approved the creation of a practical, viable, multi-tiered system of professional and ministry certification to support **early childhood teachers** currently serving in the field. Plans also call for a suite of resources that can be used by early childhood ministries and congregations to better prepare early childhood staffs for teaching in WELS schools.

Home Missions highlights

It's been a busy fall for WELS Home Missions.

- Three home mission congregations in Texas Christ Our Refuge, Waco/Hewitt; Our Savior, West San Antonio; and Amazing Grace, Amarillo – launched their first public worship services. Learn more in the November *Forward in Christ*.
- The Board for Home Missions met and reviewed what it takes to open a new mission. The Board for Home Missions is made up of the district mission board chairman and one lay volunteer from each of the 14 home mission districts. The Board for Home Missions is anticipating requests for about 30 new mission starts and 17 enhancements in the spring.
- Cross of Christ, North Nampa, Idaho, dedicated its new church building as a second-site ministry of Cross of Christ, Boise, Idaho.
- Zion, Lodi, Wis., launched its first public worship service. Zion is a secondsite ministry of Leeds, Wis. Also, Bethlehem, Richland Center, Wis. dedicated its ministry facility, which houses an intergenerational ministry center and an early childhood center.

"As WELS Home Missions prepares for the official launch of its <u>100 missions in 10</u> <u>years initiative</u> in 2023, it's exciting to see all the ministry that God is already blessing," says Mr. Sean Young, senior director of WELS Missions Operations. "We're committed to aggressively reaching lost souls throughout North America with the gospel—today and in the years to come."

OWLS joyfully gather for its annual conference

The Organization of WELS Lutheran Seniors (OWLS) met at the Stoney Creek Hotel and Conference Center in Onalaska, Wis., for its annual conference.

Convention goers were treated to a scenic bus tour of historic La Crosse, Wis., on Tuesday morning. Beginning on Tuesday afternoon, attendees enjoyed worship, fellowship, breakout sessions, and three keynote presentations. Rev. Timothy Redfield, whose daughter, Libby, was born blind, shared his family's personal story and the resources available through the Mission for the Visually Impaired. Rev. Curtiss Seefeldt talked about how to provide emotional and spiritual support for those affected by dementia. Rev. Jon Leach from Truth in Love Ministry spoke about reaching out in love to Mormons.

The OWLS again designated its offerings to support the **WELS European Civilian chaplaincy**, which serves military personnel and WELS civilians in Europe. This year, the OWLS presented Military Services a check for \$55,000.

Mr. John Paulsen, OWLS executive director, talks about the appeal of the convention: "We have good food, excellent fellowship, and great speakers," he says. "Every convention has been so well received. That's why people keep coming back." He adds, "It's like a mini-vacation from the world—and a chance to be with other people who are all trying to share the gospel." Paulsen encourages any congregation with a seniors' ministry to look into the OWLS program because it offers meaningful ways for seniors to gather and serve.

Longtime OWLS members were excited to welcome 25 first-time attendees, like Carol Kolosovsky from St. Paul's, Muskego, Wis. "It was a great joy," Kolosovsky says. "The conference reminded me of the wonderful opportunities, privileges, and blessings that seniors have in God's kingdom." Kolosovsky was also moved by the worship services and fellowship: "Whether it was reconnecting with old friends or making new friends, all of them shared their enthusiasm to share Jesus. I really look forward to meeting them all again someday."

The 2023 OWLS convention for seniors will be held Oct. 10-13 at the Holiday Inn in Stevens Point, Wis. The convention is open to all seniors in WELS and the Evangelical Lutheran Synod, regardless of OWLS membership. Learn more about the OWLS at <u>wels.net/owls</u>.
