# Sermon followed by Service

December 5, 2021

Psalm 24

Did you get the invite? I know you did; we all did. But then what? It sounded too good to be true, didn't it? And at Christmas time, who has time at Christmas time? What so often happens to invitations that sound too good to be true, invitations that cut into our busy times? They get crumpled and tossed, don't they? But you're here today, so I'm thinking that you haven't crumpled and tossed your invitation. What invitation am I talking about? David's invitation to meet the King!

When you get an invite to something special, do you ever wonder: "What am I supposed to wear? Jeans or pants, sweater or suit? Long dress, short dress? Am I supposed to bring something? What am I supposed to bring? What do you give somebody who already has everything?" Or maybe you wonder: "Is this invite, this party really for me? What kind of people are going to be there?" David helps us out: **"Who may ascend the hill of the LORD? Who may stand in his holy place? He who has clean hands and a pure heart, who does not lift up his soul to an idol or swear by what is false .... Such is the generation of those who seek him."** 

So what's the dress code? Who gets to meet the King? "**He who has clean hands and a pure heart**," a heart and soul stuck on Jesus. Our King doesn't judge a book by its cover; he has x-ray vision better than any Clark Kent, Superman, MRI, cat-scan, pet-scan. Our King isn't taken in by how we look on the outside; he isn't looking for some shallow relationship where a good look, a good life is good enough. Our King is coming to marry us! Forever! He's looking to be one with our heart and soul, together forever! So what's the right dress code? "**Clean hands and a pure heart!**" Inside and outside - a heart and soul so in love with Jesus, so looking to be connected with Jesus, that there's no thought of putting anything or anyone in his place, no thought of looking to anything or anyone but him to make life right. A heart and soul that sees Jesus - yes, Jesus with the Father and the Spirit - that sees Jesus as #1, the only 1 - the only Lord and King who can make life right for us - and he's coming to make life right for us!

So, who gets the final say in your life? Who makes life right for you? Who is it, what is it that makes life worth living for you? Do you ever have an answer other than Jesus or the God we get with Jesus? Sometimes we talk about our families that way, don't we? - that they make our life right for us. Sometimes we

treat entertainment that way - that being entertained and entertaining ourselves is what makes life worth living. What does David say? "**Lift up your heads, O you gates; be lifted up, you ancient doors, that the King of glory may come in!**" Talking to Jerusalem he says: "Open the doors and let Christ come in!" Today he might say: "Clear the streets; get rid of the stop-lights; let Christ come in!" To us he says: "Lift up your heads! Wake up! Open up your hearts and minds! Who is #1, what is #1 in your life! Get ready for Christ to come!"

Why? Who is he? **The King of Glory! The LORD strong and mighty, the LORD mighty in battle!** Our family and friends - children, spouse, boyfriend, girlfriend - their love can make life feel so right and so worth living. Our jobs, our fun and games can help make life feel right and worth living. But what about when they're not there, when they turn against us? What about when life is a battle, a battle bigger than any of us? Our King, your King, is Immanuel - God with us, not just sometimes, not just for the good times, but God with us for all times. Our King is Immanuel - God with Us in the battles of life, God with us to make life right for us.

That's right! We have Christ the King, the LORD strong and mighty, the LORD mighty in battle, on our side! Against the devil, we have God with Us, the LORD mighty in battle, to put the devil in his place! Against sin and evil, we have God with us, the LORD strong and mighty, to make us strong for the fight, to make us winners in the fight. Against sickness and death, cancer and COVID, we have God with Us, the LORD Almighty in battle, to give us life. We have God with Us, the LORD strong and mighty, coming for us - to be God's champion for us, to be God's King for us, to save us and make life right for us forever and ever, world without end, amen!

And we get to meet him! We might wonder: "How?" You remember what David said: "Who may ascend the hill of the LORD? Who may stand in his holy place? He who has clean hands and a pure heart, who does not lift up his soul to an idol or swear by what is false." If we're honest with ourselves, we admit: "My hands aren't clean and my heart isn't pure." So how can we meet the King? I think of David is Psalm 32 - "Blessed is he whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered. Blessed is the man whose sin the LORD does not count against him and in whose spirit is no deceit." I think of David in Psalm 51 - "Create in me a clean heart, O God!" The LORD who forgives; the God who creates clean hearts - that's the King who is coming to us, for us! That's what Christmas and the cross are about. Jesus came and lived life with clean hands and a pure heart. Sin and evil were all around him; sin and temptation all around him; Satan himself tempting him - but Jesus, the LORD mighty in battle, kept his hands clean and his heart pure - the devil couldn't dirty him. And the cross couldn't break him - not the pain of the cross, not the injustice of the cross, not the evil of the cross, not all our evil laid on him on the cross - the LORD strong and mighty in battle took it all, kept his hands clean and his heart pure - and paid the price for the evil and the filth in our hearts and on our hands. Today that LORD comes to you in Word and Sacrament and says to you: "Forgiven. You are forgiven. Your hands and your heart are forgiven, washed clean and pure. Forgiven, washed clean and pure to meet the King!"

That brings up a question: How do we meet him? What do we bring him? What do you give the King who has everything? David tells us - "**The earth is the LORD's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it; for he founded it upon the seas and established it upon the waters**." Everything in the world, everything we have, every thing we could give already belongs to the LORD. So, what do you get someone who has everything? "**Clean hands and a pure heart**." The hands and heart that Jesus has forgiven to be clean and pure. Hands like Jesus' hands - hands to help and hold and bless like Jesus. A heart in tune with Jesus' heart - even when Christmas plans go haywire, even when family get-togethers get stressed ... a heart so filled with God's love and God's giving that we want to love and give like he does ... a heart so in tune with Jesus that we make his work our work - at home, with his church, out in his world ... a heart so in love with Jesus, so fired up on Jesus that we wear our Christmas best, we sing our Christmas best, we give our Christmas best - all to show how great it is to meet our King! So what do we bring our King? Hands and a heart that live and love like Jesus.

And what do we get to take home? Not just stuff. Even though everything in all the world is his; he has better for us than just stuff. David says: "[You] will receive blessing from the LORD and vindication from God [your] Savior." With Jesus, you have the LORD to bless you. With Christ as your King, you have God himself vindicating you, that is, in the face of all that is wrong, you have God himself calling you right! And not just calling you right, setting you right for life with God!

What does that mean for us? With Christ as our King, every day we can wake up knowing - no matter what we need, the LORD who owns everything is our King to bless us and take care of us! With Christ as our King, every day we can

head into the world knowing no matter who or what is against us, our King is the LORD Almighty, strong and mighty, to make life right and safe for us! With Christ as our King, we can even face death, knowing that our King has life right for us in heaven. That means, with Christ as our King, we have everything we need - not just for Christmas Day, but for everyday! And we are invited to meet him!

with his innocent suffering and death.


Trusting in him, I pray: God, have mercy on me, a sinner.


Silence for meditation and reflection

#### Malachi 3:1-7b

Through God's Word and the messengers who proclaim it, the Lord humbles his people, purifying our hearts so that we might stand on the Last Day.

"See, I will send my messenger, who will prepare the way before me. Then suddenly the Lord you are seeking will come to his temple; the messenger of the covenant, whom you desire, will come," says the LORD Almighty.

But who can endure the day of his coming? Who can stand when he appears? For he will be like a refiner's fire or a launderer's soap. He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver; he will purify the Levites and refine them like gold and silver. Luke 3:1-6

*In grace, God sent his messenger, John the Baptist, to prepare people to meet the Lord.* 

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar - when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of Iturea and Traconitis, and Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene - during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the desert. #### **CONFESSION OF FAITH**

- P: Hear us, Lord, as we pray in silence.


