Sermon followed by Service

December 18, 2022

Matthew 1:18-25

I wonder how long it took him to fall asleep. His mind must have been racing, his gut churning, his heart hurting. Somehow he found out his fiancé was pregnant, and he knew he wasn't the father. Did she tell him and try to explain? Did someone else tell him? We don't know. And Joseph didn't know what to do. Should he divorce Mary and raise a stink: "It wasn't me"? But he didn't want to do that to Mary. Should he divorce Mary and keep it quiet? The thoughts had to be racing through Joseph's mind: "What should I do? What will happen to Mary? What happened? What do I do?" I wonder how long it took for Joseph to fall asleep.

And what about Mary? Was she still singing: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord"? Was she sleeping at night, or was she wondering: "What's he going to do? What will I do? God, what's going to happen?"

Joseph was thinking that sin had ruined his plans - his wedding plans, his family plans. In a way, he was right. Thousands of years of sin were ruining his plans. But Mary hadn't sinned against him. The baby growing in Mary wasn't from sin. That baby growing in Mary was from God. But Joseph either didn't know that or believe that yet.

With all that was going through his mind, I wonder how long it took him to fall asleep. When he finally did fall asleep, it wasn't a quiet sleep. An angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream: "Joseph, son of David, don't be afraid to take Mary home as your wife." "Don't worry

about the talk; it won't matter. Don't worry about Mary and what kind of girl she is, what kind of wife she'll be; she's in good with God. Don't worry about Mary and if there's some other guy; there's no one else but God."

"Don't be afraid to take Mary home as your wife because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit."

It wasn't just Joseph with his world turned upside down. God saw his world turned upside down. The peace of the Garden turned to fear and blaming, followed by anger and jealousy and murder. And now, the Peace of Rome, the Pax Romana, the great peace of the Roman Empire, was a peace enforced by fear and violence, a peace enforced by sword, a peace enforced by crucifixion. I think of a Christmas movie that came out about a dozen years ago. Two scenes stuck with me. On the edge of a small village, a dad with his family. Roman soldiers were demanding their money - tax money, protection money, extortion money. The dad didn't have enough. He begged for time; he begged for mercy. But the soldiers didn't have any. They took his young daughter instead. The other scene I remember was Mary on the way to visit Elizabeth passing empty crosses along the side of the road. There was little peace to be seen, little peace to be felt, little peace to be shared. Why? We live in a world that has turned against God. And so we live and die in world under judgment.

Joseph figured he was about to get a taste of that judgment with his world turned upside down. Instead, God was turning judgment upside down. The baby growing in Mary was from God. And not just from God. He was, he is God - Immanuel, God with us! God with Mary, God with Joseph, God with us! God with us on a special mission of peace. God

could have come on a mission of judgment. Instead, the Son of God came on a mission to save us from judgment. He came to be Jesus, our Jesus, as the angel said, "because he will save his people from their sins." That name Jesus is related to the Old Testament name Joshua. Both names, Jesus and Joshua, have the idea "the LORD saves, Jehovah saves, Yahweh saves."

It's good for me to remember what the angel said about Jesus - he's named Jesus "because he will save his people from their sins." I want a Savior to save me from sickness and death. I want a Savior to save me from going broke. I want a Savior to save me from the evil out there, the danger out there. I want a Savior to save me from my stupidity. Jesus is all that, and more, and better - Jesus will save me from my sin. He will save us from our sin. He will save us from our war against God; he will save us from the angry judgment we deserve. How? Not by helping us to be good for goodness' sake. Not by winking at our guilt - "everybody makes mistakes." But Jesus saved us by taking the angry judgment we deserve for warring against God. Jesus saved us by living the right life we owe to God. Jesus saved us by taking our place as wrong and giving us his place as right.

What does that get to mean for us? In this world of ruined peace, we get to live at peace with God. We get to know he will save us from our sickness and stupidity. He will save us from the danger and evil of the world. He will save us from death and the devil. But he won't just save us from; he will save us for. He will save us for life right with God; he will save us for life in the perfect peace of heaven.

So what do we do with that? We do what Mary and Joseph did. We take our place with God. We take the place God gives us. We live the life God gives us. For Mary, that meant serving God and his world as the mother of our Savior. For Joseph, that meant serving God and his world by serving Mary and her child as husband and father.

Taking our place with God, taking the place God gives us isn't always easy. For Mary and Joseph in Nazareth, I imagine there was talk and it wasn't all nice. In Bethlehem, if Mary and Joseph were doing God's work, caring for God's Son, why didn't God make it easier? For Mary and Joseph, taking their place with God, living the life God gave them meant shelving their hopes and dreams to find out what God had in store for them. Taking their place in God's plan meant changing their own plans to fit into God's plan.

That's not always easy for us, is it? We get set on our plans. We get set on living our life our way. We get set on thinking: "When our plans and our life fit together, that's peace." But peace isn't fitting in with our self. By our self, we're headed for death, decay, and damnation. By our self, everything we do is headed for death, decay, and damnation. Unless we live in denial, that's not peace. But we're not by our self. With Christmas, we have Jesus! We have God with us! We have God for us! We have life ahead of us! Like Mary and Joseph, we get to live a life worth living - a life with God, a life that's saved, a life of purpose, a life sharing the life and love of Jesus. And that, my friends, is a life of peace. Amen.

GOSPEL Matthew 1:18–25

This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit. Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and yet did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (which means "God with us").

When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. But he did not consummate their marriage until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus.

SERMON

NICENE CREED
