Sermon followed by Service

How do you like my "Hope-meter"? A 100 is a heart full of hope; and a 0 is nothing but hopeless. How would you score on my "hope-meter"? In many ways it's been a bad month for hope. I think we could put together a mean list, couldn't we?

And hopeless is not good, is it? Hearts that are hopeless can turn really ugly. How ugly? I'll let you fill in the picture. I want to talk about "why?" Why do hearts become hopeless?

Perhaps we're thinkers. We're supposed to be thinkers, aren't we? But somehow our thinking gets short-circuited. We look at our problems, at how life isn't treating us right, and we think about our problems, and how many our problems, and we think about our problems and how big our problems, and how impossible our problems, and soon all we can see are _____ our problems.

Or perhaps we're pointers. We don't just sit and think about our problems; we do something about our problems - we blame people for our problems. We point our finger at some people; we wag our fingers agt other people; we sometimes let ourselves get so worked up we have angry fingers, angry at the world, angry at ourselves.

And this time of year can be the worst - the worst because of all our busy stress, and worst because this time of year is supposed to be the best with peace and hope.

So what's the answer? What can we do when hopelessness has its fingers around our heart? Paul has God's answer for us - 1. Look back at God's Track-Record. 2. Look ahead with God's Prophecy.

When hopelessness has its fingers around our hearts, here's why we can dare to hope! Look back at God's Track-Record! In the Garden of Eden, God promised a Champion to crush the devil's head. And God kept his promise. In Isaiah, God promised: "A virgin will conceive and bear a Son and you will call him Immanuel." Impossible. But God kept his promise. In the town of Zarepheth, there was a widow with a son and food enough for just one last meal, but God promised, "I will provide." And God kept his promise. In our Bibles we have a thousand more pages of that. Why all that Bible History? Abraham, Isaac, Jacob; Rahab, Ruth, and Deborah; Shalmanezer, Nebuchadnezzar, Tiglath Peliezer and a bunch of other names I can't spell or pronounce - why would God tell us about them? Paul tells us – "Everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope."

So why do we have Sunday School and Family Bible Hour? It's not for families who have nothing better to do. Why do we have 1000 pages of Old Testament? It's not for Bible trivia games. We have ... God had given all this (Old Testament) to us so we can see God's track record - no matter how big the problem, no matter how big the promise - God keeps his promises.

My financial planner brother says, "Past performance does not guarantee future results." But God says the exact opposite – "Look at my past performance. I keep my promises."

Now for a tough question. Is our performance indicative of God's past performance? In other words - God keeps his promises, do we live that way? Do we live like God has a track record of keeping his promises? Or do we live like God has a track record of breaking his promises? Let me get specific - when you're looking for hope and for help, how quick and how often do you go to God's Promises? Does Bible Class and Sunday School and home devotions make it onto your schedule? A different question - when your family and friends are looking for hope and for help, how often do you point them to God's Promises? Is our performance indicative of God's past performance? If it's not, what are we saying about God?

That's why we have Advent - to point us back to God, back to his track-record, to give us real hope - God keeps his promises. And when we feel hopeless and helpless and even faithless, what is God's most important promise, his most important track record? Jesus. When Adam and Eve were hopeless and helpless and dead with the devil, God promised Jesus to crush the devil's head. When generation after generation of people were hopeless and helpless in their sin and guilt, God promised Jesus to take their sin away. When God's people felt hopeless and helpless to get it right, God promised Jesus to make it right for them. And God kept his Promise. Jesus came and put the devil in his place; Jesus came and took your sins to the cross; Jesus came to give you life made right.

That is why we can hope! Instead of dead with the devil we have life with Jesus. Instead of God against us - we have God for us! Instead of being on our own - we have God with us! Instead of having to base our hope on our track record, we get to base our hope on God's track record.

That means, instead of basing our hope on what we think we can do, we get to base our hope on God's "Look what I did!" With God all things are possible! God can! And his track record proves it! That means, instead of having to base our hope on "maybes" (maybe it'll work out ... maybe I'll be alright ... or even, maybe God'll take care of me ...), we get to base our life on God's "yes's." "Yes, I have forgiven you. So yes, I will take care of you. Yes, I will keep you safe with me. Yes, I will make your life work right with Jesus."

Yes, we can dare to hope. We have God's track record from the past. And we have God's promise and prophecy for us today.

Do you remember Jacob's dream with the stair-case to heaven, where God promised Jacob - "I will be with you"? Or how he promised Moses from the burning bush - "I will be with you"? God didn't just give that promise to his Old Testament people, Jesus promises you - "I will be with you always even to the end of the ages."

Do you remember Daniel in the lion's den or the three men in the fiery furnace and how God kept them safe? God's promise is still true for you -- "Call on me in the day of trouble and I will deliver you! ... Nothing in all creation can separate you from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus."

Do you remember the trouble and heartache in Joseph's life being sold into slavery by his brothers, being thrown into prison for being faithful to his master - and how God used Joseph to save his family? Or how God used the heartache in Ruth's life to bring her into the line of the Savior? God wasn't just keeping his promises then; he's working his promise for you today -- **"In all things God works for the good of those who love him.**"

One more – Do you remember the promise Jesus made on the night he first served his Lord's Supper - "**Because I live, you also will live.**" Life with God forever in heaven – that's God's promise for you.

I know we are in some difficult times, difficult times for hope. But we can dare to hope. Why? Look at God's track record. And look at his promise – we've got a better life coming. Amen.

FIRST READING

A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit. The Spirit of the LORD will rest on him the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of might, the Spirit of the knowledge and fear of the LORDand he will delight in the fear of the LORD. He will not judge by what he sees with his eyes, or decide by what he hears with his ears; but with righteousness he will judge the needy, with justice he will give decisions for the poor of the earth. SECOND READING

Romans 15:4–13

For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through the endurance taught in the Scriptures and the encouragement they provide we might have hope.

May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had, so that with one mind and one voice you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Accept one another, then, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God. For I tell you that Christ has become a servant of the Jews on behalf of God's truth, so that the promises made to the patriarchs might be confirmed and, moreover, that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written: "Therefore I will praise you among the Gentiles; I will sing the praises of your name."

Again, it says,

"Rejoice, you Gentiles, with his people."

And again,

"Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles; let all the peoples extol him."

And again, Isaiah says,

"The Root of Jesse will spring up, one who will arise to rule over the nations; in him the Gentiles will hope."

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Matthew 3:1-12

In those days John the Baptist came, preaching in the wilderness of Judea and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." This is he who was spoken of through the prophet Isaiah:

make straight paths for him.' "

John's clothes were made of camel's hair, and he had a leather belt around his waist. His food was locusts and wild honey. People went out to him from Jerusalem and all Judea and the whole region of the Jordan. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River.

Produce fruit in keeping with repentance. And do not think you can say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' I tell you that out of these stones God can raise up children for Abraham. The ax is already at the root of the trees, and every tree that does not produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire.

"I baptize you with water for repentance. But after me comes one who is more powerful than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor, gathering his wheat into the barn and burning up the chaff with unquenchable fire."

NICENE CREED
