Luke 6:17-26

Be ready to cover your ears; be ready for the coyotes to howl!
Oh, what a beautiful morning,
Oh, what a beautiful day,
I've got a wonderful feeling,
Everything's going my way.

How many of you have heard the song? From the musical _____. Curly is on his way to see Laurey; he's twitterpated, bursting into song - "Oh, what a beautiful morning,

Oh, what a beautiful day, I've got a wonderful feeling, Everything's going my way.

Ever feel that way? We could use more days, even some days like that, right? Days with everything going our way. Imagine a day like that. You wake up when you want to. You wake up refreshed, with a smile, and everyone you see has a smile. You go to work, and everything works. You go to school, and all is cool. You go to the store, and everything is on sale. You go to the doctor, and you go home cured. You go on vacation; the plane lands early; your rental car is upgraded; the sun shines every day. Everything goes your way. We could use some days like that, right?

Jesus was having one of those days. After days of people picking at what he said, picking at what he did, after days of people getting in his face, against him, looking to turn others against him, Jesus goes off and away; he spends a night praying on the side of a mountain. He wakes up the next day with a smile, calls his disciples close, chooses 12 of them to be apostles. He leads and brings his disciples down the mountain to a level place. And what he saw could have had him singing: "Oh, what a beautiful morning, Oh, what a beautiful day, I've got a wonderful feeling, Everything's going my way." Instead of people looking to cause him trouble, Jesus saw disciples looking to be close. Instead of people against him, Jesus saw disciples coming from north and south, coming from days away. Jesus saw people coming to him for help. "Oh what a beautiful day!"

And those people going to see Jesus, what kind of song do you think they could have been singing? Think about it - for the most part, what kind of people were looking to Jesus? People who had something wrong in their life, right? Their bodies sick, broken, tormented by evil spirits; their hearts hurting and broken; their lives, their communities feeling kicked around, crushed, by injustice and evil. What kind of song could they have been singing? Ballads bitter, broken, and blue.

But they're on their way to see Jesus. And what have they heard about Jesus? He's healing the sick, casting out demons; with a word, he's making the crippled well to walk. And when the people coming to see Jesus get close, when they hear what's happening, what do they hear? People are healed just by touching Jesus. Can you imagine the song in their hearts? "I've got a wonderful feeling, Everything's going my way." Can you imagine what they might be hoping? "Healthcare today! What's next? How about freedom, so we can be free to live our own lives? How about justice, a life where we're treated right? How about the good life, so we can live in comfort? Life is looking up!"

It's then that Jesus looks into the eyes of his disciples: "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. Blessed are you who hunger now, for you will be satisfied. Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh."

I'm not sure I like what Jesus is saying. "Blessed are you who are poor, hungry, weeping"? I don't want to be poor, hungry, weeping. I want more; I want better; I want happy. I want the good life; I want everything going my way.

But what does Jesus say about the "good life"? "Woe to you who are rich, for you have already received your comfort. Woe to you who are well fed now, for you will go hungry. Woe to you who laugh now, for you will mourn and weep. Woe to you when all men speak well of you, for that is how their fathers treated the false prophets."

Before I said: "I'm not sure I like what Jesus is saying." Now, with these "Woes," I'm pretty sure I don't like what Jesus is saying. I have a nice house, and I like it. I'm well fed, and I like it. Most every day, I get to laugh. In so many ways, life is good. But what does Jesus say? "Woe." And not just "woe," Jesus says the good life of this world will be gutted, reversed, turned upside down. Not just for the snoots and snobs. Not just for the 1%. Not just for those who live off the rest of us, who live high by stepping on the rest of us. The good life of the world that we so easily chase and long for, the good life of the world that we so dangerously put ahead of God's life for us - the good life of this world will be gutted, reversed, and left empty.

That kind of sucks the life and the joy out of "I've got a beautiful feeling, everything's going my way," doesn't it? Does that mean life here is pointless? That the best we can look forward to is gathering and garbaging? Living the life of the world is in the end, a life of gathering and garbaging, either a life of hurt and heartache followed by a worse hurt, or a life of pretending followed by the ugly, awful reality of God's judgment. But living the life of the world, chasing the life of the world, gathering and garbaging, pretending goodness and then forever weeping and gnashing - that's not our only option.

You may remember something Jesus said in our lesson. Jesus looked into the eyes of his hurting people and spoke to their hurting hearts: "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. Blessed are you who hunger now, for you will be satisfied. Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh." Jesus has hope; he has a promise for us. And you may have noticed that I skipped a couple verses. "Woe to you when all men speak well of you, for that is how their fathers treated the false prophets." And "Blessed are you when men hate you, when they exclude you and insult you and reject your name as evil, because of the Son of Man." That doesn't sound good, does it? But listen to what Jesus says next: "Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, because great is your reward in heaven." There is a different life to live than the life of the world that ends gutted and empty. Jesus offers a life that celebrates forever in heaven.

How do we get that life? Not by living poor, hungry, and hurting. And not by living: "I've got a wonderful feeling everything's going my way." No, the way to God's good life, the way to God's best life, is through Jesus. Not Jesus the healer; not Jesus the teacher; but Jesus our Savior. He doesn't just teach us how to live right by God; he lived life right by God for us. He doesn't just heal our bodies; he heals our hearts and souls and sets us right with God.

How? Not by chasing the good life and serving it up for us on a platter. No, but by sacrificing himself and serving his life up for God and for us - how? By living a life of love for others, and then by sacrificing himself for God and for us on the cross. By his sacrifice of self on the cross, Jesus paid for the way we put living the good life of the world ahead of living the life God has for us. By his sacrifice of self in life, Jesus lived for us the life we need to be right by God. And now what? Jesus isn't living a life of sacrifice, forever hungry, poor, sad, and empty. No, today Jesus is living and celebrating in heaven, sitting at God's right hand, approved by God, sharing God's blessing and approval - inviting "Come to me all you who are weary and burdened," promising "and I will give you rest," forgiving "Peace, your sins are forgiven you!" and promising and pointing to heaven "in my Father's house are many rooms ... I am coming back to take you to be with me, that you may be where I am." In heaven

where "there will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain." In heaven where we will be face to face with God living and celebrating the good life, living and celebrating the best of life.

How do we live that life today? It's not a matter of living poor, hungry, and hurting. We get to live with Jesus and his promise ahead of us. With Jesus at our side and his promise ahead of us, we don't need to get stuck living the life of the world like this world and this life are all that matters. We get to live God's life sharing the love of God, even if it costs us friends or family. We get to live God's life sharing the treasures of heaven, even if it costs us lifestyle and comfort. We get to live God's life even if it costs us here, because with Jesus we have the best of life coming.

Think about it. Whether you're living with plenty or in want, with family and friends or with the world against you, healthy or not - with Jesus, you have your best life ahead of you. And that's why we get to live: "Oh, what a beautiful morning, Oh, what a beautiful day, I've got a wonderful feeling, Everything's going my way." Amen.

But Jesus, my Savior, paid for my sins


with his innocent suffering and death.


Trusting in him, I pray: God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit."


