Luke 5:1-11

How cool would it be to be Peter? Last week, you heard it. Jesus goes to Peter's house and heals his mother-in-law. Imagine Jesus going to your house, and healing your family. Or Jesus taking you for a special day-trip, to the top of a mountain, and there he shines like the sun and shows you his glory as God. Or imagine that same Jesus washing your feet, then inviting you to pray with him. Imagine Jesus giving you the keys to the kingdom of heaven, and giving you a new name - a nick-name from Jesus. Think of all that Jesus did for Peter; think of what Peter got to do with Jesus. How cool would it be to be Peter?

What's your favorite happening with Peter?

Now put yourself in Peter's place in our lesson. You're tired, and maybe a bit frustrated. You've been working all night with nothing to show for it but a mess to clean up. You've been fishing all night with not a fish to show for it. Now you're cleaning your nets getting ready for another night of fishing.

What do you imagine going through Peter's mind? What might go through our minds after a fruitless day on the job? ... after a fruitless endeavor at church?

Jesus is there by the shore. A crowd is gathering around him. People want to hear what Jesus has to say. You want to hear what Jesus has to say.

You know that Jesus. He stayed at your house, ate at your table. You've talked. You've listened. He speaks the Word of God. He heals with the power of God. He's come with the promise of God to save the people of God.

Now a crowd is gathering around him listening. You want to be part of that crowd, don't you? But Jesus has something better for you than to be just one in a crowd. Jesus sees your boat; he gets into your boat; he asks you to put out from the shore. You get a front row seat as Jesus talks to the crowd. Then when Jesus is done talking to the crowd, Jesus turns to you. He has something more in mind for you. Jesus wants to bring you in to what he is doing.

Sounds good, doesn't it? Jesus has come from God. He speaks the word of God. He works the power of God. He brings the promise of God to save. And he wants to bring you in to what he is doing. How cool is that?!

But what Jesus says to you doesn't make sense. "Put out into the deep waters and let down the nets for a catch." Doesn't make sense. Any fisherman on the Sea of Galilee knows that the way to fill your nets is to fish in the shallows and to fish at night. And that's what you did. You know your stuff. You know the way things work. And what Jesus says just doesn't make any sense.

What does Jesus say to you that doesn't make any sense?

So what do you do? Do you argue with him; tell him the way things work in the real world? Do you ignore him? After all, he doesn't know the lake like you know the lake. He doesn't know your business like you know your business. On the other had, Jesus does know God. And he does come with the power of God. So what do you do? "Master, we've worked hard all night and haven't caught anything. But because you say so, I will let down the nets."

And what happens? When you let down the nets, when you do what Jesus says, you catch so many fish your nets begin to break. You call for your partners in the other boat to come and help. You fill both boats so full they begin to sink.

What does that miracle mean for you?
... how has Jesus filled your nets?

Now what? Seeing the fish ... seeing what Jesus just did ... it's like a slap in the face, like one of the lake's ten-foot waves hitting you in the face, like a boat oar slapping you upside the head. "Go away from me, Lord; I am a sinful man!" "Who am I next to Jesus? Who am I to think I could know better than Jesus? I'm not good enough to be with you, Jesus. What are you doing with me, Jesus? "Go away from me, Lord; I am a sinful man."

But what does Jesus say? "**Don't be afraid; from now on you will catch men.**" Jesus, speaking the word of God, working with the power of God, coming with the promise of God, says to you: "Don't be afraid. I've got a place for you working with me." How cool would it be to be Peter?

As we come out of COVID-time - God-willing - how would you like to join Jesus fishing for people?

What would be helpful to you, to encourage and equip you in fishing for people?

To be like Peter - sometimes we're kind of cool to that idea, aren't we? We're busy; we're tired; we're frustrated; and Jesus wants to include us in his work. It can be easy to think: "Not me, not now; find someone else." When Jesus calls us to speak up

and make disciples, it can be easy to think: "You don't know me like I know me. This isn't for me." When Jesus calls us to forgive, to be gentle and kind, it can be easy to think: "You don't know these people like I know these people. Forgiveness isn't for them." When Jesus sets the offering plate up front - as a call for us to partner with him - it can be easy to think: "Jesus, you don't know my bills like I know my bills; you don't know my business like I know my business," so to look good, to feel good we toss in a token. Or to get down on our knees and admit we've been wrong? To deny ourselves and face a cross for following Jesus? Sometimes, instead of thinking it cool to be like Peter, our hearts are cool, even cold to being like Peter.

Jesus didn't need Peter; he doesn't need us. If he wanted, Jesus could make snowmen to do his work. If he wanted, he could print money faster than the government. Jesus could side-line us all; he could disqualify us all. After all, we've sidelined ourselves; we've disqualified ourselves in more ways than we know. But Jesus doesn't want you left out; he wants you brought in. So Jesus took our place, on the cross he paid the price for the ways we've gone AWOL ... he paid the price for the times we've thought we know better than God. Taking our place in life and in death, Jesus earned for us a place right with God. Not just in heaven, but here in this life. Here in this life, Jesus wanted to include Peter in his work. And here in this life, Jesus - the Jesus who comes from God, the Jesus who works the power of God, the Jesus who comes with God's promise to save and give life - that Jesus wants to bring you in to his work, he wants to work through you.

What if Jesus decided to go with a change of plan - instead of working through his people, he would create a willing and eager force of snow-people to do his work? How would that feel - relieved, disappointed? How would that change your life?

Think of what Jesus wants. Jesus wants our children raised as God's children, to enjoy the Father's blessing, to share his home in heaven. He wants our families to know his love and promise. He wants the lost and wandering to be found. He wants the hurting to be comforted, the helpless to be helped, the dying to know life. That's awesome, isn't it? Here's where it gets even more awesome. Jesus wants to do all that -through you!

Just like Jesus worked to bring Peter in to his work, Jesus is at work to bring you in. Just like with Peter, he invites us in close to listen, to share in his promise and power. Then, like with Peter, he tells us to do things that don't make sense - "deny yourselves, give, forgive, make disciples of my enemies." Just like he did with Peter, Jesus stretches our faith beyond what makes sense; he pulls us into his promise and power. And there he sets us up to do the work of God. Just like with Peter, he invites us to see things, to do things only God can do. And just like with Peter, he gives us a new name with a new

life; he puts his name on us and lives his life through us. How cool it is to be like Peter! Amen.

Trusting in him, I pray: God, have mercy on me, a sinner.


Silence for meditation and reflection



NICENE CREED

LORD'S PRAYER




WORDS OF INSTITUTION
