Sermon followed by Service

March 12, 2023 Romans 12:1-8

It's just about time. Less than a month to Easter. Less than a month to Easter eats, and no one is signed up to bring sainted eggs and sausage bites. Pastor makes his plea: "In view of God's mercy, can you help?" So Mrs. Hen says to Mrs. Porker: "In view of God's mercy, let's do this. Let's offer ourselves to take care of Easter breakfast." So Mrs. Porker thinks - pigs are very smart, you know - and she pictures bowls of hard-boiled eggs and the special-shaped plates of sainted eggs, but she smells the heavenly grease of sausage bites. And Mrs. Porker says to Mrs. Hen: "Offer ourselves? That's easy for you to say. Offering yourself means giving up a few eggs, and then you get to stand by and watch. Offering myself means going to the butcher and sausage grinder. You'll just be involved; I'll be committed."

When Paul by the Holy Spirit calls on us "to offer ourselves" is he calling on us to be involved like the chicken or committed like the pig? When I hear Paul: "**Offer your bodies as sacrifices**" ... When I hear Moses: "**Love the Lord your God** with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength" ... When I hear Jesus: "Deny yourselves ... pick up your cross and follow me" – God isn't just calling us to be involved, to give a little and then stand by and watch. He isn't just calling us to give up some thing, but we can still be ourselves. No, God is calling us to sacrifice ourselves, to quit being ourselves, to quit living for ourselves; God is calling us to give ourselves 100% to him because we belong 100% to him.

To live with God - not just sometimes or even most times, but to live 100% with God - that's why God created us. To live with God - as the holy ones of God - that's why God saved us. To live with God - as the body of Christ - doing God's good, putting evil in its place, showing and sharing the glory and love of God - that's God's purpose for us.

And if we have any argument with that he says: "**Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought**." And if we still argue with that ... if we think we can live our own lives giving God a little off the edge now and then ... if we think we can live in the middle between commitment to self and commitment to God ... even if we think it's alright to run 90-95 % committed to Christ ... check out what Jesus says to his churches in Revelation. He's ready to spit out the lukewarm swimming in the middle and he's ready to pull his blessing out from those who think it's OK to run less than 100% for God.

Hearing that we might hear some arguing voices inside us. They might sound sensible, reasonable. But they're arguing against the Jesus who says: "Deny yourselves"; they're echoing Satan who says: "Be true to yourself; do what you want." They're voices that need to silence before they take us over and God silences us. Hearing what God says about commitment: "Love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength," instead of making excuses, we need to turn to God: "Father, forgive us."

And then, God, instead of giving us excuses, shows us his commitment - Christ and the cross. Christ didn't settle for an easier kind of commitment (a little off the edge); but he prayed, he lived, and he died - "**not my will, but your will be done**." And God - seeing Christ's cross, seeing Christ's commitment to him - God is willing to see you and me and the world as committed to him. In Christ's cross and sacrifice for sin, God is willing to see the world's sin paid for and gone. In Christ's cross and commitment God sees you forgiven and right, committed and commissioned - co-missioned with God - to work God's great work in this world, committed and commissioned to live and rule with Christ in heaven.

Does that mean that God wants us to make the pig's commitment to butcher knife and sausage grinder? For some of us the answer to that question might be "yes." Look at the apostles' shields - knife - sword - spear - cross. But that's not God's call to us in our lesson. Here God calls us to "**offer our bodies as living sacrifices**." To be a living sacrifice means taking care of ourselves, not just emptying ourselves for God, but filling ourselves, or better, letting God fill us. In the Old Testament God scheduled it for his people - every week a day off and a day in - a day off from work for body and mind to rest and recuperate - a day in Worship and Word getting God's rest and recuperation for heart and soul. In the New Testament God doesn't schedule it for us; we get to schedule it for us.

Let's make sure we do that and let's insist on it from our leaders and teachers and our whole body! As pastor and teachers, as Bible Class leaders and Sunday School teachers, as church leaders and school leaders - as dads, moms, grandparents and Godparents, as brothers and sisters - have I left anyone out? - let's show that offering ourselves as living sacrifices isn't just a matter of giving and doing, but to be a living sacrifice means filling up on the life-giving word of Jesus. Otherwise our leading and teaching will become less and less about Christ, shallower and shallower, and our giving and doing will be less about Christ and more and more about ourselves. To be living sacrifices holy and pleasing to God we must be filled and refilled with the life and the heart of Christ.

Then we will see that the best place on the farm to find the committed Christian isn't in the chicken or the pig, but in the vine and the branches. As living sacrifices we don't just give up some thing we have, but we give ourselves to God. And we don't just give ourselves as a one-time gift to God; day after day we give ourselves to be part of the living body of Christ with Jesus himself living and working in us and through us. We do that in bringing Jesus to our families; we do that in bringing Jesus to our world where we work, and live, and play. And - Paul wants us to know - we do that by living and working in the body of Christ, living and working in Christ's church.

I know that's not always easy. I know there are times one

part of the body offers to help and another part of the body forgets. Times one part of the body tries to help, and another part of the body gets in the way. I know there are times parts of the body feel unappreciated. And other parts feel that they don't have anything to offer. And other parts think they don't have the time. And on and on. We can all think of our hurts and excuses and reasons not to offer ourselves to work in the body of Christ. And we can let those hurts and excuses and reasons keep us from offering ourselves.

But we don't have to live stuck in view of those hurts and excuses and "reasons." That's not the view God has for us. Instead, we get to live in view of God's mercy and promise. We aren't just chickens to sit on the sidelines, and we're not pigs to be run through the grinder. We are branches connected to the vine; we are part of the body of Christ with Christ living in us. If you don't know what you can do ... if you would like to be doing something more, something different, let's talk. And as living sacrifices let's offer ourselves to the work God has for us - it's the God-Lived Life. Amen.

SERVICE OF THE WORD



Romans 12:1–8

Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.

For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the faith God has distributed to each of you. For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully.
