Sermon followed by Service

March 6, 2022

Genesis 3 and Luke 4

If you were to draw a picture of Satan, would you draw his face with a smile or with a scowl? With a look of evil or a look of concern? It's his smile and his pretending to care about us, his pretending to want what's best for us, that make his lies especially dangerous, isn't it? With a smile and a look of concern he pretends and lies; with a smile and look of concern he puts out fake news and disinformation. With a smile and a look of concern, he wages a war of words against God and God's Word.

We see it in the Garden of Eden. Satan slithers in pretending to be helpful. He puts the idea out there for Adam and Eve that God is looking to keep us down, that God's Word is too constricting, that listening to God's Word is holding us back from a better life. Slithering and pretending to be helpful, Satan puts it out there that we'd be better off if we muted what God says and did our own thinking and choosing. Who doesn't like to hear that -"You're better off doing things your way than God's way"? "Your thinking is better than God's thinking"? "You'd be better off muting God, changing his channel"? You know what Adam and Eve did with that, with Satan's disinformation and lies. What about us? How may times, how many ways, has Satan gotten you? How many times, how many ways has Satan gotten us to mute God's Word, to switch the channel?

We see Satan with his same war on God and his Word out in the wilderness. Jesus isn't out there in the wilderness for a nature hike; the Holy Spirit led him there to do battle with Satan, to be tempted by Satan. We hear Satan appeal to pride - "If you are the Son of God." We hear Satan appeal to comfort and ease - "tell this stone to become bread." We hear Satan offer an easier way to rule the world - "bow down and it's all yours." We hear Satan twist God's Word and offer an easier way to gain a crowd - "jump and he'll keep you safe." Do you hear the appeal - "My way is easier than God's

way"? And Satan's claim - "My word for you is better than God's Word, God's promise, God's command."

Why? In the Garden, in the wilderness, in our lives, why does Satan mess with God's Word? God's Word is God's way to connect with us. God doesn't just use a plate of brownies or a trail of bread crumbs to connect with us; he uses his Word. He doesn't just grab us and drag us where he wants us; he uses his Word. You've heard Jesus' promise: "God so loved the world that he gave his One and Only Son that whoever believes in him shall not perish, but have eternal life." Where does believing come from? Where does faith come from? Not a plate of brownies, a trail of bread crumbs, or even God's grip. "Faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the Word of Christ."

God's way to connect with us isn't grab and drag. God's way to connect with us isn't to impersonally program and reprogram us against our will. God's way to connect with us isn't just to sit back and watch us do our thing; that's not really connecting, is it? God's way to connect with us is by his Word. With his Gospel Word in here [Bible], he calls us, speaks to us, and wins our hearts with his promise of love. God connects to us through his Word.

So, if Satan wants to disconnect you from God, what would you expect Satan to do? Sometimes he might take away the plate of brownies God gives us so we grouse about how hard life is with God. Sometimes he might give us a trail of bread crumbs to lead us into sin. But mostly - to separate us from God, or to keep us separate from God - Satan messes with the Word that connects us to God.

How? Satan doesn't present himself as out to destroy you. He comes with a smile, with a look of concern. Maybe with a question - "Did God really say...? - looking to create doubt. Or a word of encouragement - "Be true to yourself" - that sounds better to our pride than God's Word. He

might offer a word - "there's a quicker way, an easier way, a better way to live" than what God says in his Word. Whatever he says or does, you can count on this - Satan will mess with God's Word to mess with your God connection.

And it can sound so good. Until what? Until we realize what we lose by listening to the devil. Adam and Eve realized what they lost right away. Sometimes we live in the devil's lies for years muting God, changing the channel. Some people live in their lies - muting God, changing God's channel - until they meet God face to face and hear his judgment - "Away from me, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels."

We live in a world with so much fake news and disinformation swirling in us and around us. And we can't just point our finger at Satan or out there at them; with our sinful nature we love to latch on to fake news and disinformation. With all the voices in us and around us telling us to mute God and to pick our own channel, it is so easy to be like Adam and Eve and to think our way better than God's way and God's Word.

Did you notice what God did for Adam and Eve? He didn't just write them off; he didn't just click them off. Instead God went calling, inviting. And he does that same thing for us - calling, inviting - through his Word, through his people. Sometimes he gives us a wake-up call and a shake, a pinch or a poke to wake us up to listen - "Where are you? What are you doing? Who are you listening to?"

We might not like the way God pinches or pokes, but when God calls you, when he nudges you, don't do what Adam and Eve did. Don't think you're better off hiding. Don't think you're better off blaming others and excusing yourself. Don't wait for God to do a grab and drag; don't wait for God to do a forced reprogramming. Instead, listen to his Word, and answer like the tax-collector we heard on Ash Wednesday - "**God, have mercy on me a sinner.**" Listen to his Word that gives what God has for you - a Champion to crush the devil's lying head - the Word that quashes and quiets the devil's lies - a Savior on a cross to pay for the ways we've muted God - a Defense Attorney speaking up for you, at his right hand in heaven, speaking God's Truth - "Forgiven, full and free, right by God and right for heaven."

That word of forgiveness, that word of God's truth, connects what Satan's lies broke. With Jesus and his Word you have life with God, here and forever in heaven. Let me tell you something I look forward to in heaven - no more lies, no more fake news, no more disinformation, no more he-said-she-said. No more wondering "Who's right, what's right, who's telling the truth?" No more doubting the wisdom of God's Word; no more doubting the Truth of God's love. Instead, perfect peace with God and his Word.

Today, we're still surrounded by the fake new, lies, and disinformation. But we aren't on our own. Out in the wilderness, you saw how Jesus put the devil in his place. You heard how Jesus handled Satan's challenges to God's Word, how Jesus handled Satan's twisting of God's Word. Jesus took God's Word in the Bible - not some secret Word he brought from heaven. He took the Word he learned from his mom and dad, the Word he learned in confirmation classes, the Word he heard and learned in church - Jesus took the Word, and with it he squashed and quashed the devil's lies.

You have that same Word in here [Bible]. You can have that same Word ready for action in here [heart and mind]. Reading the Bible, digging into the Bible, Bible Study - isn't for people with extra time on their hands. Reading the Bible and Bible Study are for people who are tired of dealing with lies and disinformation, for people tired of wondering and doubting. Reading the Bible and Bible study are for people who love God, who love God so much they want to know more and more about him. And reading the Bible and Bible Study are for people dealing with Satan's lies, people fighting to put the devil back in his place. All that sounds like us, doesn't it? In here, you have what God gives to connect us to him. In here, you have what God gives to defend us with him.

So don't settle, and don't fall for the disinformation out there and in here [heart]. With Jesus and his Word, you have something better - you have the Truth of God! Amen.

But Jesus, my Savior, paid for my sins


with his innocent suffering and death.

FIRST READING

Now the serpent was more crafty than any of the wild animals the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God really say, 'You must not eat from any tree in the garden'?"

The woman said to the serpent, "We may eat fruit from the trees in the garden, but God did say, 'You must not eat fruit from the tree that is in the middle of the garden, and you must not touch it, or you will die.' "

When the woman saw that the fruit of the tree was good for food and pleasing to the eye, and also desirable for gaining wisdom, she took some and ate it.

She also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it. Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they realized they were naked; so they sewed fig leaves together and made coverings for themselves.

Then the man and his wife heard the sound of the LORD God as he was walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and they hid from the LORD God among the trees of the garden. But the LORD God called to the man, "Where are you?"

SECOND READING

2 Timothy 3:14-4:5

But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it, and how from infancy you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is Godbreathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work. In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who will judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I give you this charge: Preach the word; be prepared in season and out of season; correct, rebuke and encourage—with great patience and careful instruction. For the time will come when people will not put up with sound doctrine.

Instead, to suit their own desires, they will gather around them a great number of teachers to say what their itching ears want to hear. They will turn their ears away from the truth and turn aside to myths. But you, keep your head in all situations, endure hardship, do the work of an evangelist, discharge all the duties of your ministry.


Lead us to believe that at every age your Word remains a lamp for our feet and a light to our path.





LORD'S PRAYER




WORDS OF INSTITUTION
