Sermon followed by Service - May 11, 2025 - John 10:25-27

You heard it - "no need to worry. No need to worry about anything." Are you there yet? I'm not. So how do we get there? Or better, how do we get there [stained glass window lamb] - "The LORD is my shepherd, I'm set - no worries."

In our lesson, there were some people who didn't want to get there, at least not with Jesus as Shepherd. Jesus was getting in their way, crimping their style. If they didn't have Jesus in their way, they could do what they wanted, get what they wanted; they could live life, handle life the way they wanted ... or so they thought. But listening to Jesus was messing with their conscience, messing with their pride, getting in the way of their freedom to live life their way.

Sound familiar? Have you ever thought - "if we didn't have church on Sunday ... if I didn't have Sunday School and Bible Class ... if I didn't have to sit around waiting for that home devotion ... if I didn't have Jesus telling me what to do, what not to do - then I could do what I want, when I want, the way I want." Ever been there? Listening to Jesus can mess with our sense of freedom, our pride, our conscience. So what do we do? Sometimes we pretend that Jesus doesn't matter or care what we do. Sometimes we pretend we're all fine and good without Jesus.

So what does Jesus do? Before our lesson and after our lesson Jesus calls out the fakes and frauds, the pretenders. But in our lesson, Jesus tells us about his real sheep. "My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them

eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one can snatch them out of my hand."

Sounds good, doesn't it? Sheep of the Shepherd - real sheep of the real Shepherd - get to face life safe and secure. Now it doesn't always feel that way, does it? As confirmands (and no matter what our age, we're all being confirmed - either confirmed with God or confirmed with the world) ... every day it is good for us to re-live our confirmation as we face what's coming. Every day we have new challenges, new opportunities, new temptations, new troubles, new lessons to learn, new tests to pass. Some days it can be tiring, overwhelming, and maybe even scary - and it's good for us to be re-confirmed in God's promises and strength. Some days are exciting and invigorating - and it's good to be re-confirmed in the direction God wants us to go. Some days, people fill our ears with all sorts of garbage, some of it stinky, but some of it sounds so good ...; it is good for us to be re-confirmed, to fill our ears and hearts with what Jesus says.

And what does Jesus say? Exactly what we need to hear. How can that be? Jesus knows you. He knows your hurts; he knows your struggles. He knows when you need a lift or a nudge or a hook. He knows what you need to hear today. Jesus knows what you need from him.

So what does Jesus say? "I give [my sheep] eternal life, and they shall never perish." What does that mean for us? "I will dwell in the house of the LORD forever." We might think, "That will be great then and there, but what about here and now?" Confirmed with Jesus, "Surely goodness and love will

follow me all the days of my life." Again we might think: "Sure sounds great, but I'm not seeing it. When I look around, it's all dark." And what about those dark times, what do we get to remember? Confirmed with Jesus - "Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me, your rod and your staff, they comfort me."

We want that, don't we? When we're in the valley of the shadow of death ... when we're in deep and dark with trouble all around us, we want Jesus with us, don't we? Because if Jesus isn't with us, then we're like sheep without a shepherd. And what do we know about sheep without a shepherd? Sheep without a shepherd can't find their way. Oh, they think they can, but they get themselves lost, in trouble and in danger. Sheep without a shepherd are easy prey, easy pickings for the thief, the wolf, the coyote. Sheep without a shepherd are as good as dead.

It's no fun to think about, but we've all been there. Just like Isaiah said: "We all like sheep have gone astray; each of us has gone our own way." But the Good Shepherd didn't leave us lost and on our own. He didn't leave us as good as dead. No, the Good Shepherd became one of the sheep, and not just any sheep, Jesus came as the Lamb of God. As the Lamb of God, Jesus took the sin of the world. As the Lamb of God, Jesus took your sin and mine; he took our place as guilty. As the Lamb of God, Jesus was cursed and crushed, crucified and killed - all to pay for our sin, all to set us right with God. But that altar isn't a memorial to a dead lamb; that [stain-glass] window isn't a memorial to a dead shepherd. With Easter, Jesus lives! Jesus lives to save and

protect. He lives to lead and provide. Jesus lives to find us and call us.

And that's what he's done; that's what he's doing! Jesus has found you! He's calling you! You get to say: "I'm set."

"The LORD is my Shepherd; I shall not be in want. You get to know: "I'm in a good place; I'm going to a better place."

"Surely goodness and mercy will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the LORD forever." You get to sing, with sweet abandon: "I am Jesus' little lamb."

So now what? Walk off? Wander off? Go our own way? No, what does our Shepherd say? "My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me." Jesus' sheep listen to his voice. We listen to his voice in here [Bible]. We flock together to listen to his voice in worship, in Family Bible Hour, Sunday School, Bible Study. Why? Oh, I could give you a sales pitch for worship and Bible Study together and tell you: "it's relevant and important; it's good for us and worth our while." And even if you don't think so, it would still be true. Or I could say: "people who love each other are eager to listen to each other." But Jesus simply says: "My sheep listen to me; my sheep follow me."

So don't shelve your shepherd; don't bury him in a pile. Don't blow him off or rush on by like you have something more important to do. Don't think you need to be given the right sales pitch for Bible Study to be worth your time. You don't. Sheep have nothing more important in their life than the voice of their

shepherd; without our shepherd we're as good as dead. So listen to the voice of your Shepherd; follow him, flock together to hear him; and then what? He will make this true for you - "The LORD is my Shepherd; I shall not be in want. ... Surely goodness and mercy will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever." Amen.
