Love each other and show what your God is about!

Four year old Jenny falls off her bike and runs crying to mom. Mom kisses the bummed-up knee; the crying stops. What made everything "all-right"? Love. Mom's had a rough day. Just about everything that could go wrong, did go wrong. The head-ache is raging. But the dishes and homework get done without a fight; and when she tells Dad how everything went wrong, he listens, really listens. The headache rages on, but it doesn't hurt as bad inside. What made the difference? Love.

After months of church shopping the couple finally stopped looking and settled down. What made the difference? A church of people with love. Grandma was lonely, real lonely after Grandpa went home with Jesus, day after day she felt alone and forgotten, but then somebody from church stopped by for a visit and grandma knew she wasn't alone. What made the difference? Love.

It's amazing what love can do - it can dry tears; fix knees; heal hearts; it can make strangers feel at home. And something else. Our love can show our goodness; it says: "I think you're special." Add Jesus and your love shows God's goodness and says: "God thinks you're special."

What have you seen and/or experienced love do?

If love can do such great things, why is love so hard? What gets in the way?

How would you answer those questions?

We could talk about schedules running us crazy, stress making us edgy; we could talk about hurts from our childhood, hurts from the divorce that make it hard to love today. But that wouldn't get to the root. At the root, what gets in the way of my love. I do.

Think of Jesus' disciples that first Maundy Thursday. What did they argue about? "Who's going to be greatest?" When Jesus told them that one of them would betray him; what was most important? "What about me?" And when Jesus was arrested, what was most important? Self-preservation. What gets in the way of love? Using words from that first Maundy Thursday - greatness and glory; our greatness and glory.

We can be very protective of our glory and greatness. "What about my rights!" "Nobody tells me what to do." "Nobody gets to hurt me ... or take advantage of me." "I'm not getting involved in their mess." In countless ways we try to protect our greatness and glory.

And it gets in the way of love. We command and demand when we should get off our high horse and listen and encourage. Or when love needs to be tough, we get wishy-washy and hold back on God's commands and judgments. Or instead of reaching out in love, we take the easy way out and instead of being present, disappear. In so many ways, in trying to protect our

greatness and glory, we lose our love. And where would that leave us? Not just loveless, but godless - and that is what hell is.

So what is the answer? Where can we find what it takes to love? And more importantly, how can we be saved from our lovelessness? Jesus shows us the answer - God's greatness and glory. How does God's greatness and glory take care of our love problem? Let's see what Jesus has to say.

Our lesson starts off: "When [Judas] was gone, Jesus said, "Now is the Son of Man glorified and God is glorified in him. If God is glorified in him, God will glorify the Son in himself, and will glorify him at once." God was about to glorify his son Jesus and show off his greatness. How? With a show of glory like on the Mount of Transfiguration? No. With a miracle show? No. With a voice thundering from heaven? No. God had done all that before. So how would God show off his greatness this time? The answer is in the first words of our lesson – "When Judas was gone, Jesus said, "Now is the Son of Man glorified." It was Maundy Thursday night; Judas had just left. Now Jesus would be betrayed, rejected, put on trial, mocked, beaten, spit on, crucified, killed, crushed and cursed. Not our idea of glory, is it? But it does show God's glory - the greatness of his love - that he was willing to go through all that for you, for me.

So what is God's greatest glory? The glory that God wants you to know more than anything else? The bigness of his heart. We saw the bigness of God's heart when Jesus reached out and touched the untouchable leper. We saw the bigness of his heart

when Jesus ate with the unforgivable "sinners." We saw the glory of God's big heart when Jesus, the Son of God, washed his disciples' stinking feet. But then when Jesus sacrificed himself to pay for our selfish lovelessness so we can have God's love - there Jesus showed the greatest glory of God's heart. Today God still shows off that glory - to the loveless he says: "I love you." To the guilty: "I forgive you." To the helpless: "Let me take care of it for you." To the nobodies - "You are a chosen people, a holy nation, a people belonging to God. … you're my children, the children of God." With Jesus, that's the love God has for you.

So what do we do with that love. Jesus says: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

Love one another. How? That word for love isn't just a feeling word; it's a doing word, an action word. Love as Jesus has loved you, give without looking to get back; do even though someone sometime may take advantage of you; sacrifice even though it may not be appreciated. Love one another as Jesus has loved you; not because they deserve your love, but because they need your love. Love as Jesus has loved you, not just when it is easy, but even when it hurts. Look how Jesus took action to meet your needs; and love as Jesus has loved you.

So whom do we love? Jesus said, "Love one another." Love God's family as your own family, as your own brothers and sisters. That's a whole lot of people to love, isn't it? So where

do we start? We usually start with the people we like the most, the people we know the best. And that's a good start. But what will that kind of love do? Chances are, it will leave somebody out, feeling ignored, unloved, and hurt. People who are hurting too much to be friendly will keep on hurting. Strangers will keep on being strangers. So love as Jesus has loved you and reach out. Those people here you don't know very well ... they're your brothers and sisters, so reach out and love them like Jesus loves you. Those who don't seem very loveable, even those you just don't get along with ... God loves them, he found a way to get along with them, so reach out and love them like Jesus loves you. Or those people who hurt you ... God has forgiven them, so reach out and love them like Jesus loves you.

How can we do that? The power to love isn't found inside ourselves; some days we look inside our self for love and we don't feel much more than hurt and selfish - not exactly what it takes to love. In the same way, the power or reason to love them isn't found in them; looking at them, instead of seeing a reason to love, we might see their faults, how they hurt us, or maybe just plain nothing - hardly what it takes to love.

So how can we love? Bring Jesus into the picture. When you look to yourself, bring Jesus into the picture - look at how Jesus has met your needs. When you look to that heart God gave you to love, bring Jesus into the picture - look at how Jesus can meet their needs. Look at how Jesus loves you - full and free - and there we find what it takes to love one another.

And tears will be stopped, hearts will be healed, the lonely will feel loved, strangers will feel like they found a family - and best of all, people will see what God is about. Amen.

READING 1 Corinthians 13:1-11




