Five days. Five more days of school. Not even five days, because on Friday we have our school picnic. Then what? Three months of fun in the sun. No school, no homework. Instead, for days and weeks, you get to ride your bikes, go swimming, and play with your friends. Some of you will get to go camping and fishing; maybe you'll stay in a cabin or a house on a lake and go boating; some of you will go on a road trip across America. Three months of brats and burgers, watermelon and ice cream, baked beans and, if you know what's good for you, German potato salad. Sounds too good to be true, doesn't it?

Our eighth graders chose a class verse that sounds even better - "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans to give you peace, not disaster, plans to give you hope and a future."

To get a feel for just how wonderful this promise is, we have to go someplace we don't want to go - a place of sad, scary feelings. Are you ready? Have you seen someone sad and scared and they can't stop? Have you ever felt sad or scared and couldn't stop feeling sad or scared? Have you ever felt lost? - you didn't know where you were, or how to get home. Ever been lied to by someone you trusted? Ever had your favorite something taken away from you, stolen, broken? Ever had someone you love die? One more, have you ever felt like your whole world, even God, is against you?

Any one of those is an awful feeling. Put them all together - what an awful, miserable place to be, isn't it? That's what life was like for the people God is writing to in our lesson. Young and old, they were ripped from their homes and taken hundreds of miles away. They didn't know where they were going; they didn't know the way back. At the same time, their favorite things were taken away - stolen, lost, and broken. People they loved were killed. All around it looked and felt like everybody was against them, that God was against them. Oh, some people promised: "Don't worry. It won't be long. Everything will be alright." But they were lying. Oh, what an awful, miserable feeling.

That's when God told Jeremiah to write them a letter, to share with them his promise: "I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans to give you peace, not disaster, plans to give you hope and a future."

It looked, it felt like everybody was against them. It looked, it felt like even God was against them. Ever felt that way? Some day, if you do, remember what the LORD says: "I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans to give you peace, not disaster, plans to give you hope and a future." No matter what it looked like; no matter what it felt like - God wasn't against them. He hadn't forgotten them. He still thought of them; he still had plans for them. Not plans to hurt them, but plans to give them peace, plans to give them hope, plans to give them a future. What kind of future? A life of Shalom - Shalom, the Hebrew word for peace - life the way it's supposed to be. In a world gone wrong, the LORD was

promising his people peace, hope, a future - life the way it's supposed to be.

Today, or maybe I should say those times you're in that dark place, that scary place, when it seems that everything is going wrong, that everybody is against you, know this - God gives you much the same promise - in Jesus.

- When your world is filled with voices commanding you and demanding you, judging you, and it feels like you can never do enough and never do good enough, listen to the voice of Jesus invite you: "Come to me all you who are weary and burdened and I will give you rest" no commands, no demands, no judging.
- When it seems your whole world is against you, listen to Jesus: "I have overcome the world" no matter what this world is doing, Jesus has won, and with Jesus, you win!
- When you're on edge because you just know bad things are coming, trouble is coming, death is coming ... when it seems that nothing good is coming, listen to Jesus: "Do not let your hearts be troubled. I'm coming for you ... and goodness and mercy are chasing you ... and you get to dwell in the house of the LORD forever!"
- When your conscience reminds you of all those things you did wrong; when your conscience tortures you with all those you should have done, but didn't; when your conscience reminds you what a bleep you have been, and the voices lie to you: "Jesus doesn't want you; Jesus can't help you; Jesus isn't coming for you; the only way Jesus is coming for you is to curse and crush you;" remember Jesus

on the cross - "Father, forgive them." Remember Jesus giving his body and blood for the forgiveness of your sin. Remember, and listen to Jesus forgiving you - "Your sins are forgiven; go in peace."

Jesus says: "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans to give you peace, not disaster, plans to give you hope and a future."

How? When? Where? Some people won't like this. They want Jesus to promise them peace in their sin; they want Jesus to promise peace and prosperity in living the life of the world without him. But Jeremiah doesn't promise peace in sin; he doesn't promise prosperity in living the life of the world without God. And neither does Jesus. God's promise of peace and prosperity through Jeremiah was for people who would seek him and follow him. God's promise of peace and prosperity through Jesus comes with a call to repent, to leave the sin of the world, to leave our sin. Listen to Jesus' promise of life - "My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one can snatch them out of my hand." Jesus' promise of life is for his sheep, for those who listen and follow. And Jesus' promise of prosperity, Jesus' promise to take care of us, isn't for those looking to live the life of the world, but for those seeking to live his life - "Seek first the kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things [everything you need] will be given to you as **well.**" Did you notice? There is a place where Jesus promises peace and prosperity. It's not out there living the life of the world without him. The place where Jesus promises peace and

prosperity is with him, in tight with him, as sheep following their shepherd.

As you graduate, whether you're graduating from here to another school, or you're graduating from today to another day, as you graduate in this world ... not every day will be fun in the sun ... not every day will have ice cream and watermelon. You will have days when it seems that everything is going wrong ... days when it seems that the whole world is scowling at you ... days when it seems you have nothing to look forward to. For those days, and for every day, remember this promise - "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans to give you peace, not disaster, plans to give you hope and a future" - in Jesus. Amen.






