Sermon followed by Service

June 5, 2022 - Pentecost

Acts 2:1-21

You're tired, dragging, feeling a bit overwhelmed. Perhaps you have something big coming up. How do you energize? Maybe coffee, Mt. Dew - anything with caffeine. Or something with sugar a cookie, a Cliff Bar, a chunk of chocolate. How do you power up? Maybe you amp up the music or get some exercise or both.

Now, here's a different question. I'll set it up. It's not just you tired and dragging. It's not just you with something big coming up. How do you energize someone else who is tired and dragging? How do you power someone else who is facing something big, something that will need more energy, more power than they have? Some nag; some command and demand, boss and bully. Others give cookies and carrots hoping that the cookies will give enough energy so keep people chasing the carrots.

What does God do? ... for us, for his church? ... to energize the tired, the dragging? He has his ways to wake us, doesn't he? Sometimes he shakes us awake with a kick and a bang. Sometimes he loves us awake with a kiss. And then to keep us awake, to get us moving, what does he do? He doesn't just command and demand, boss and bully; he doesn't nag. I suppose we could say he gives us cookies and carrots. He puts heaven out in front of us and every day he gives us the promise and blessing we need so we keep reaching for heaven.

And what about when we're feeling overwhelmed? Or we have that big something big ahead of us - that big challenge that has us on edge, the big opportunity we've been waiting for? What does God do for us, for his church to power us for that something big? Good question. I know many of us are feeling overwhelmed, and most all of us are facing something big, aren't we? Some of us are graduating this year. Some are moving. Some of us are facing big changes at work, at home, maybe with our health. And God has some big changes for us in his church, doesn't, he? What does God do for us ... what does God do for his church to power us for the something big?

Before our lesson, Jesus had something big in mind for his disciples, something big in mind for his church. So what do we see Jesus' disciples doing? Getting together. Getting together for prayer. Getting together to encourage each other with Jesus' love and promise. When they felt small and alone, they could encourage each other - "We've got Jesus, and Jesus has us."

When they felt guilty for sinning against God, when they felt guilty for sinning against each other, they could encourage each other -"Look to Jesus and the cross. He took your sin and mine. You don't need to beat yourselves up. You don't need to worry: 'when is God going to make me pay.' No, Jesus already paid for you, for me, for the world. We get to live forgiven!"

And when those disciples felt hopeless, helpless, not sure what was coming, they could encourage each other: "Let's pray together. With Jesus, you're right by God, and he'll find a way to make life right for you." As those disciples gathered together and prayed together and encouraged each other, what happened? God powered them.

And then, in our lesson, on Pentecost, God powered them in a special way. First, they heard the sound of a rushing wind coming down from heaven and filling the house where they were staying. Then they saw what looked like tongues of fire on each of them.

Soon they were speaking in different languages. God was giving his Holy Spirit to power his people for his something big. They were able to speak like they had never spoken before. They were able to reach out and point to Jesus like never before. By his Spirit, God was powering his church for his something big.

Hearing that, we might be tempted to think: "So? That's great for them, but what about us? We're all here today, praying together, encouraging together. But we don't hear any wind. We don't see any tongues of fire. We aren't speaking in different languages. So where's the Spirit, where's the power for us?"

Sometimes we might think that if we don't feel the Spirit, that if we don't see or experience Pentecost-proof of the Spirit, then we must not have the Spirit working in our lives. But think about that. After Pentecost, we don't hear any more sound of wind from heaven, but that doesn't mean the Spirit wasn't at work, does it? After Pentecost, we don't see any more tongues of flame, but that doesn't mean the Spirit wasn't at work. After Pentecost, we do hear of special times when people spoke in tongues, with a special gift to speak in languages they hadn't learned; but we don't have any promise or any command that we're supposed to be able to speak in tongues today. Does that mean the Spirit isn't at work in Christ's church today? No!

As we heard Peter preach on Pentecost, God has promised his Spirit to his church; he has promised his Spirit in baptism. What does that mean for you? Baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, you have the Spirit of God alive in you to power you. So ...

On those most horrible days, when it seems that everything is going wrong and everyone is against you, and it seems impossible to believe God's love and promise are for you, you have the Spirit of God to power you to look up: "I'm not alone; God isn't against me. I have Jesus and his Spirit for me and with me. It doesn't matter what the rest of the world thinks of me; it doesn't matter what I think of me; Jesus and his Spirit are holding me right with God."

And on those big days, those hard days when you feel too small for what's coming, on those big days when God has something big for you - someone needs you to be nice to them, someone needs you to forgive them, someone needs you to help them ... on those days when God has something big for you, instead of thinking, "I can't" or "it won't do any good" - you have the Spirit of Christ living in you to power you to live and love with the heart of Jesus. You have the Spirit of Christ so you can take on the hard days and the big days with the strength of Christ: "I can do everything ... I am strong for everything through Christ who makes me strong."

On Pentecost, we heard the Spirit work with the sound of wind and speaking in tongues. On Pentecost, we saw the Spirit work with what looked to be tongues of fire. Today we see and hear the Spirit work in different ways; we see him work in your words and works of kindness. We see the Spirit work in your optimism and eagerness to serve. When you love with the heart of Jesus, when you share the peace and promise of Jesus, again, we see and we hear the Spirit at work in you. When you make time for a project here at church and school, when you squeeze and stretch to grow your offering here for church and school, when you use God's gifts for God's purposes, - in all those ways - you show you have the Spirit at work in you.

I know. Some days we might feel tired and dragging. Some days we might feel overwhelmed, what's going on and what's ahead seems too big. On those days, we get to remember we have something better for energy than caffeine and sugar. We have something better for empowering than kicking and commanding, even better than grumbling and nagging. For our tired days, for our big days - we have the Spirit of Christ. And he is alive in you! Amen.

+ CONFESSION OF SINS AND ABSOLUTION +


- M: God invites us to come into his presence and worship him with humble and penitent hearts. Therefore, let us acknowledge our sinfulness and ask him to forgive us.

- C: Amen.



Genesis 11:1-9

Now the whole world had one language and a common speech. As people moved eastward, they found a plain in Shinar and settled there.



SECOND READING

Acts 2:1–21

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken. Utterly amazed, they asked: "Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans? Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?"

Some, however, made fun of them and said, "They have had too much wine."

Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: "Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. These people are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning! No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel:

" 'In the last days, God says,

I will pour out my Spirit on all people.

Your sons and daughters will prophesy,

your young men will see visions,

your old men will dream dreams.

Even on my servants, both men and women,

I will pour out my Spirit in those days,

and they will prophesy.

I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood and fire and billows of smoke.

The sun will be turned to darkness

and the moon to blood

before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord.

And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.'
