# Sermon followed by Service

1 Samuel 17

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Ever seen a Goliath? An enemy so giant ... a problem so giant ... it just stops people stuck. Ever heard a Goliath? "You're too small, too weak! Mess with me, I'll squash you! You don't have what it takes! And your God, he don't [sic] have what it takes either!"

Ever seen a Goliath ... heard a Goliath? The answer is "yes," isn't it? Your personal Goliath may be health - cancer, a heart problem, some other sickness. Your Goliath might be family troubles - troubles with the spouse, troubles with the children, troubles with the ex. Your Goliath might be money troubles, job troubles, or something else. You've seen your Goliaths, heard your Goliaths, haven't you? Our lesson can help.

But our lesson isn't just about the goliaths that we face in our personal lives. In our lesson Goliath was standing up against God's people to break God's people - so they couldn't do what God's people do - live in peace, grow strong together, live with God's blessing and take God's kingdom into the world. By standing up against God's people, Goliath was standing up against God's church. As a church we have our Goliaths, don't we? We have a whole world shouting against us - not just against what we teach, but shouting, or maybe worse, whispering, tempting - "Be true to yourself. You come first." As a church, we have our Goliaths - bills and budgets and building. As a church, we have our Goliaths - apathy, complacency. As a church, we have our Goliaths - and they aren't all evil, some are just overwhelming - long lists of people we want to see, long lists of projects that need to be done. It's not just out there where we face our Goliaths; we can see our Goliaths, hear our Goliaths, right here - not so?

So how do you kill a Goliath? The people in our lesson didn't know, did they? They saw Goliath - nine feet tall; they heard Goliath - "you don't have what it takes!" And they were stuck - stuck in fear stuck so all they could do was talk. Talk about how bad it was; talk about how great it would be if someone else took care of Goliath; talk - "he's too big": talk - "we can't do anything"; talk that whined and complained and tore each other down. The Israelites saw their Goliath; they heard their Goliath; But that's not all they saw and heard ... they saw each other; they heard each other ... and they were stuck.

But David was different. He knew how to make a difference. He knew how to kill a Goliath. How? Use What God Has Given You!

Back to the question - how was David different? In the eyes of his brother, in the eyes of King Saul, in the eyes of Goliath, David was just a boy compared to a giant; just a shepherd boy compared to a warrior giant. But David wasn't looking at himself - "I can do it." And David wasn't looking at Goliath - nine feet tall, 125 pounds of armor, carrying a spear with a point as heavy as a bowling ball. No, David was looking to the Lord Almighty! The LORD Almighty who had delivered his people out of Egypt, through the Red Sea, drowning his enemies. David had his eyes on the Lord Almighty who had brought his people into the Promised Land and cleared out their enemies before them. David was looking to the LORD who had rescued him from the lion and the bear, the LORD who had given him the courage and strength to kill the lion and the bear. So how was David different? How could David go up against Goliath? First, David didn't just look to himself; and think and talk about how little he could do. Second, David didn't just stare at Goliath and think and talk about how big the enemy was. No, David looked to the LORD Almighty. So David thought different and he talked different. To King Saul he talked: "**The LORD who delivered me from the paw of the lion and the paw of the bear will deliver me from the hand of this Philistine**." And to Goliath he talked: "You come against me with sword and spear and javelin, but I come against you in the name of the LORD Almighty, the God of the armies of Israel ... This day the LORD will hand you over to me ... and the whole world will know that there is a God in Israel. ... for the battle is the LORD's...!"

Wow! So different from the other talk up and down the battle line. But it wasn't just talk. David followed through and put his talk into action. David didn't wait for God to make him bigger. He didn't wait for God to give him a bigger spear. King Saul thought David needed armor and helmet and spear, but David wasn't a soldier. So David used what God gave him and he put God to work. You know what he did. He picked five smooth stones from the stream; and when Goliath came in for the attack, David ran to meet Goliath. He took a stone, slung it with his sling; and what happened?

God gave him the victory! The stone struck Goliath in the forehead and dropped him. A boy against a giant; a shepherd boy against a warrior giant; a simple stone against an armored giant. It didn't make sense. No wonder Goliath boasted he would feed David to the birds. But the LORD Almighty took the faithful effort of that shepherd boy David and he took that stone and God gave Israel a victory that will stand forever. David knew what to do in the face of a Goliath. For David it was simple - use what God gives you and put God to work.

What does that mean for us? Well, we have our Goliaths, don't we? Challenges that can seem every bit as daunting and impossible as Goliath. Challenges that seem every bit as loud as Goliath - "You're too small! You don't have what it takes!" And sometimes we get stuck like the Israelites. Stuck waiting for someone else. Stuck waiting for things to get easy. Stuck waiting for God to snap his fingers. Sometimes we call it procrastination. Sometimes we call it hopelessness. Sometimes it's just plain selfish laziness. But Goliath was wrong! And the Israelites sitting and stuck were wrong. And when we're stuck, we're wrong too. Not because we're bigger than our Goliaths, not because our Goliath challenges are small and easy. But, because we have the God of David!

We have that same great God as David! Think about it - we used to be as godless as Goliath - mouthing off and fighting against God and his people. There have been so many times we got stuck and quit on God. But instead of striking us down, instead of quitting on us, God has called us to his side like David. He's given us David's greater Lord. You know him as Jesus. Like David, Jesus stepped in and stepped up for us. But not just against a Goliath, Jesus stood up for us against Satan. Instead of just slinging a stone, Jesus stood in for us on the cross. There Jesus paid for the times we mouthed off against God. There he paid for the times we've been let ourselves get stuck. There he paid for the times we've talked others into being stuck instead of standing up with God. Now, with Jesus, God sees you like David, as a forgiven friend near and dear to his heart. But even more importantly, with Jesus, God sees you as Jesus, right for life with him. Not just right for life with him in heaven, but right to be like David - to step up, to step in, to make God's difference in the world today.

You know some of the Goliaths you face, that your neighbors face, that we face here. And you probably know how easy it can be to be stuck like the Israelites. But you also know what David knew that our God, the LORD Almighty is greater than an army of Goliaths. You know what God did through David - how he stood up and struck down Goliath. Even better, you know what God did through Jesus his love, his care, his cross, the crown he has for you in heaven.

For the Goliaths we face today, God has given us so much more than stones. You have the very Word of God, with the power of God to heal hearts and save souls. You have the Spirit of God, with his power in you to love, to care, to help and serve, to make God's difference in the world. And you have the stuff of God, not just stones, but his money and stuff to do his work and work his blessing.

Like David, with the Lord, you have what it takes to make God's difference. Like David, you have what it takes to be God's blessing in the face of Goliath. Amen.

# SERVICE OF THE WORD

#### FIRST READING

### 1 Samuel 17:4–11, 32–40, 45–52

A champion named Goliath, who was from Gath, came out of the Philistine camp. His height was six cubits and a span. He had a bronze helmet on his head and wore a coat of scale armor of bronze weighing five thousand shekels; on his legs he wore bronze greaves, and a bronze javelin was slung on his back. His spear shaft was like a weaver's rod, and its iron point weighed six hundred shekels. His shield bearer went ahead of him.

Goliath stood and shouted to the ranks of Israel, "Why do you come out and line up for battle? Am I not a Philistine, and are you not the servants of Saul? Choose a man and have him come down to me. If he is able to fight and kill me, we will become your subjects; but if I overcome him and kill him, you will become our subjects and serve us." Then the Philistine said, "This day I defy the armies of Israel! Give me a man and let us fight each other." On hearing the Philistine's words, Saul and all the Israelites were dismayed and terrified.

David said to Saul, "Let no one lose heart on account of this Philistine; your servant will go and fight him."

Saul replied, "You are not able to go out against this Philistine and fight him; you are only a young man, and he has been a warrior from his youth."

But David said to Saul, "Your servant has been keeping his father's sheep. When a lion or a bear came and carried off a sheep from the flock, I went after it, struck it and rescued the sheep from its mouth. When it turned on me, I seized it by its hair, struck it and killed it. Your servant has killed both the lion and the bear; this uncircumcised Philistine will be like one of them, because he has defied the armies of the living God. The LORD who rescued me from the paw of the lion and the paw of the bear will rescue me from the hand of this Philistine."

Saul said to David, "Go, and the LORD be with you."

Then Saul dressed David in his own tunic. He put a coat of armor on him and a bronze helmet on his head. David fastened on his sword over the tunic and tried walking around, because he was not used to them.

"I cannot go in these," he said to Saul, "because I am not used to them."

So he took them off. Then he took his staff in his hand, chose five smooth stones from the stream, put them in the pouch of his shepherd's bag and, with his sling in his hand, approached the Philistine.

David said to the Philistine, "You come against me with sword and spear and javelin, but I come against you in the name of the LORD Almighty, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have defied. This day the LORD will deliver you into my hands, and I'll strike you down and cut off your head. This very day I will give the carcasses of the Philistine army to the birds and the wild animals, and the whole world will know that there is a God in Israel. All those gathered here will know that it is not by sword or spear that the LORD saves; for the battle is the LORD's, and he will give all of you into our hands."

As the Philistine moved closer to attack him, David ran quickly toward the battle line to meet him. Reaching into his bag and taking out a stone, he slung it and struck the Philistine on the forehead. The stone sank into his forehead, and he fell facedown on the ground.

So David triumphed over the Philistine with a sling and a stone; without a sword in his hand he struck down the Philistine and killed him.

David ran and stood over him. He took hold of the Philistine's sword and drew it from the sheath. After he killed him, he cut off his head with the sword.

When the Philistines saw that their hero was dead, they turned and ran. Then the men of Israel and Judah surged forward with a shout and pursued the Philistines to the entrance of Gath and to the gates of Ekron. Their dead were strewn along the Shaaraim road to Gath and Ekron.

### SECOND READING

#### Ephesians 6:10–17

In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.
