Sermon followed by Service - John 14:1-6 - VBS - June 29, 25

Ever get lost? I find it easy to get lost. Back in the days before GPS and maps on our phones, I was driving south from Boulder, Colorado, to Denver. I didn't have directions or a map, but I had the mountains. As long as I could keep the mountains on my right, I would be heading in the right direction, south. But then I found myself driving in mountain cloud fog. When I got out of the fog, I found the mountains on my left; instead of heading south toward Denver, I had gotten myself completely turned around, heading north. Another time I was mountain hiking with some pastor and teacher friends. Pastors and teachers are supposed to be smart, supposed to know the way. We had maps and compasses to show us the way. But the trail-heads and much of the trails were still under snow. We thought we knew where we were; we thought we knew where we were going. Nope. I find it easy to get lost.

I find it easy to get lost. So I find it amazing that people can use the stars to find their way. Look up into the sky at night, find the Dipper - is it the Big Dipper or the Little Dipper? - follow the pointer stars at the end of the bowl, and there you have the North Star. There you might have the North Star. Me, I find it easy to get lost. This past week in VBS we talked about the North Star, about Jesus as our North Star.

When I heard that (Jesus as our North Star), I thought: "What does that mean?" So I looked it up in the Bible. I found Jesus as the Morning Star, the star telling us a new day, a better day is coming. We like that - don't we? - a better day is coming.

I found Jesus as the Sun of Righteousness, the star that give us a new day, a new day of healing, a new day with life made right. But I couldn't find Jesus as our North Star. So I googled it. And what did I find?

For some people, Jesus as our North Star means: Jesus gives us direction; he guides us, tells us the way to go. Sounds good, doesn't it? In a world with so many different people telling us so many different things about right and wrong, so many people telling us: "Do this; don't do that," ... in a world where it can be so easy to be confused and lost ... it is so good to have Jesus as a North Star guiding us, giving us directions, showing us where to go and how to live. Last week, Jesus told us: "Love one another" A couple weeks ago, we heard Jesus give us direction, a purpose in life - "You will be my witnesses."

When Jesus gives us direction, what do we know? His directions are good and wise, even better, Jesus' directions are godly and right. We don't have to worry about Jesus giving us wrong directions, or Jesus leading us the wrong way. Jesus' directions on what to do might be different from the directions we hear from our friends. Jesus' directions on how to live life might be way different from what we hear out in the world. Jesus' directions might be hard; they might seem impossible; we might not like what Jesus has to say. But because Jesus' directions are God's directions, we know that Jesus' directions are good for us, that Jesus won't lead us into getting lost.

What else do we know? I find it easy to get lost. When Jesus says, "Go right," time and again, I go left. When Jesus

says, "Go forward," time and again, I get stuck, or go backward. I need more than Jesus telling me what to do and which way to go - otherwise, I will surely be lost. Not just lost in the clouds driving north in the fog when I should be driving south. Not just lost wandering in the woods. But lost in myself, lost following the ways of the world, lost in thinking my way instead of thinking God's way, lost in going the world's way instead of going God's way; lost in sin, my sin, the world's sin; lost and leaving God, arguing against God, fighting against God. In all that, we might think we're going the right way, until that hard day we find out we're lost and guilty before God, lost and damned before God, lost and headed for hell.

Lost and leaving God. That can't be fixed with a new set of directions. There is a part of us that will fight against God's directions, Jesus' directions, until the day we die. And even if we could follow Jesus' directions perfectly the rest of our lives - which we can't - there's no way we can fix what we've already broken, no way we can make right what we've already done wrong. What does that mean for us? We need Jesus to be more than a North Star that guides us; we need Jesus to do more than just guide us and direct us and show us the way to go. If all Jesus did for us was guide us and direct us and show us the way to go we would be lost.

Today, we thank God Jesus did more; Jesus is more than just a guiding North Star. In our lesson, Jesus' disciples were on edge, in the dark, they were feeling a bit lost in what was going on, lost in what was coming up. They knew trouble was coming. Jesus had already told them he would be arrested and crucified. Now, that night, he was telling them they would betray him, deny

him, abandon him. The disciples knew trouble was coming, but they felt lost not knowing what to think or do.

So what did Jesus do? He didn't just give his disciples a set of directions; instead, Jesus gave his disciples a promise. Instead of letting his disciples stay stuck in the darkness of their confusion, Jesus pointed them away from themselves, away from this world; he pointed them to himself and to a place far, far above the North Star we see in the sky. "You trust in God; trust also in me. In my Father's house are many rooms. ... I am going there to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am."

Jesus isn't just a nice guy or a good friend pointing us to a better life; Jesus is the Son of God who will take us to be with him in heaven. How? Not by giving us directions. Not by guiding us. Not by showing us the way. No, Jesus is the way.

Think of Jesus when he was a school-age child. When Jesus listened to his mom and dad and obeyed them, when Jesus went to church and to Temple, Jesus wasn't just showing us what to do, Jesus was living for us, in our place, as our substitute. When Jesus healed the sick and fed the hungry, Jesus wasn't just showing us to be nice to people, take care of people, Jesus was living for us, in our place, as our substitute. When Jesus taught his disciples and the crowds - "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength," and "Love your neighbor as yourself," when Jesus shared God's invitation and promise: "Come to me all you who are

weary and burdened and I will give you rest," Jesus wasn't just showing us how to say good and godly things, Jesus was living for us, in our place, as our substitute. And when Jesus went to the cross and was crucified, it wasn't just because some people didn't like Jesus; Jesus went to the cross for us, in our place, as our substitute. Then, when Jesus rose back to life on Easter Sunday, God didn't raise Jesus to life just for Jesus' sake, God raised Jesus to life for us, to give his life to us.

How does he do that? In baptism, God covers you and connects you with the perfect life of Jesus. At the same time, in baptism, God covers you and connects you with the death of Jesus. But that's not all; in baptism, God connects you with the Easter life of Jesus, a life that will last forever into heaven. Using the Word of God and baptism, the Holy Spirit makes you alive with Jesus. Now, through faith in Jesus, you are forgiven. Through faith in Jesus, you have God's promise to look out for you and take care of you. Through faith in Jesus, you have heaven ahead of you. How? Why? Not because Jesus shows us the way, but because Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life.

I told you I find it easy to get lost. So you can be sure I'm not here because I found Jesus. No, I'm here because Jesus found me. And Jesus has found you and chosen you - not just to follow Jesus as your guiding North Star, but to see Jesus as the Way, the Truth, and the Life - the Star who gives you life. Amen.



CONFESSION & ABSOLUTION OF SINS




