



FIRST LESSON 1 Samuel 1:1-20

There was a certain man from Ramathaim, a Zuphite from the hill country of Ephraim, whose name was Elkanah son of Jeroham, the son of Elihu, the son of Tohu, the son of Zuph, an Ephraimite. He had two wives; one was called Hannah and the other Peninnah. Peninnah had children, but Hannah had none.

Year after year this man went up from his town to worship and sacrifice to the LORD Almighty at Shiloh, where Hophni and Phinehas, the two sons of Eli, were priests of the LORD. Whenever the day came for Elkanah to sacrifice, he would give portions of the meat to his wife Peninnah and to all her sons and daughters. But to Hannah he gave a double portion because he loved her, and the LORD had closed her womb. And because the LORD had closed her womb, her rival kept provoking her in order to irritate her. This went on year after year. Whenever Hannah went up to the house of the LORD, her rival provoked her till she wept and would not eat. Elkanah her husband would say to her, "Hannah, why are you weeping? Why don't you eat? Why are you downhearted? Don't I mean more to you than ten sons?"

Once when they had finished eating and drinking in Shiloh, Hannah stood up. Now Eli the priest was sitting on a chair by the doorpost of the LORD's temple. In bitterness of soul Hannah wept much and prayed to the LORD. And she made a vow, saying, "O LORD Almighty, if you will only look upon your servant's misery and remember me, and not forget your servant but give her a son, then I will give him to the LORD for all the days of his life, and no razor will ever be used on his head."

As she kept on praying to the LORD, Eli observed her mouth. Hannah was praying in her heart, and her lips were moving but her voice was not heard. Eli thought she was drunk and said to her, "How long will you keep on getting drunk? Get rid of your wine."


"Not so, my lord," Hannah replied, "I am a woman who is deeply troubled. I have not been drinking wine or beer; I was pouring out my soul to the LORD. Do not take your servant for a wicked woman; I have been praying here out of my great anguish and grief."

Eli answered, "Go in peace, and may the God of Israel grant you what you have asked of him."

She said, "May your servant find favor in your eyes." Then she went her way and ate something, and her face was no longer downcast.

Early the next morning they arose and worshiped before the LORD and then went back to their home at Ramah. Elkanah lay with Hannah his wife, and the LORD remembered her. So in the course of time Hannah conceived and gave birth to a son. She named him Samuel, saying, "Because I asked the LORD for him."

GOSPEL LESSON Matthew 7:24-30

SERMON 1 Samuel 1:1-20

What a miserable place to be. It was supposed to be a safe place. Home is supposed to be a safe place, isn't it? - a place where you can let down your guard and relax; a place where you know you are loved, and cared for, and special; a place where, instead of expecting shots, you know your heart is safe. Home is supposed to be a safe place. Even more so, church is supposed to be a safe place, God's house with God protecting, a place of peace.

What makes a home to be a safe place? What makes a home an unsafe place?

What makes a church to be a safe place? What makes a church to be an unsafe place?

For Hannah, home wasn't a safe place, not even God's home was a safe place, at least not safe for her heart, not safe from hurt or heartache. At home were children with the sounds of children. Each child, each sound reminding her that she didn't have children, that she couldn't have children. That's right, the children at home weren't her children; they were the children of her husband and his other wife. The other wife who could have children and did have children. Her

husband's other wife, she knew Hannah's pain, and she exploited it. She knew how Hannah hurt, and she poured salt in the wound. She knew how Hannah felt a knife in her heart, and she twisted that knife. She knew how Hannah felt forgotten, forgotten by God; and when it was church time, she made sure that Hannah hurt all the more.

Where was Hannah's husband? He was there. I think he tried. I think he tried to show his love. But it didn't do much good. He didn't know what to do, what to say. And Hannah felt tortured in her soul.

How could Hannah's husband have been a better husband?

But what about God? Hannah believed in God, didn't she? Well, for Hannah, it sure felt like God had forgotten her, like he didn't care. Worse, it felt like God was in some way responsible for Hannah's hurt and heartache. And in a way, he was.

Why might we say that God was in some way responsible for Hannah's hurt / heartache?

In what ways was God not responsible for Hannah's hurt / heartache?

What a miserable place to be; what a miserable life to live. Have you ever been there? An empty hole in your heart, an empty hole in your life? And to make it worse, instead of having somebody there for you to fill that hole in your heart with love and care, instead you've got a somebody in your life who fills that hole in your heart with hurt and hate? Instead of somebody to support you, you've got somebody always picking at you, picking, picking, picking. Ever been there? Your heart broken, afraid for your future, feeling helpless, hopeless? And the best anyone has for your broken, hurting heart is a band-aid? And as for God? You call, but he doesn't answer. It seems, it feels like he has forgotten you, that he doesn't care about you. You're afraid to think it, but some days it even feels like he's turned against you. Ever been there with God, thinking God is against you? What a miserable place to be, what a miserable way to live, isn't it?

When you are in that miserable place, what do you do?
When someone you know is in that miserable place, what do you encourage them to do?

So what do you do? In our lesson today, we see what Hannah did. (More importantly, we see what God did.) She poured out her heart to the LORD. She didn't hold back. She didn't pretend this was no big deal. She wept and she sobbed and she shook; she prayed and she prayed and she prayed. Her lips were moving, but no words were coming out. And Eli, the High Priest, thought that she was drunk.

Have you ever let loose and cried and prayed like that? Have you ever poured out your heart to God like that so that people around you thought something was wrong with you, that they tried to stop you? Listen to Hannah let loose: "O LORD Almighty, if only you would look on your servant's misery and remember me." Or listen to David let loose in the Psalms: "Why, LORD? How long, O LORD? What are you going to do? Answer me, God! It's time for you to answer me!" Listen to Jesus let loose: "Abba, Father, if it is possible, take this cup away from me." Over and over, he prayed. His anguish so intense, on a cold, cold night, sweat was running off his forehead. Listen to Jesus let loose: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" At the same time, listen to Jesus keep it together: "Not my will, but your will be done. … Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." It's alright to join them. To pour out your heart to the LORD.

What "let loose, pour it all out" prayers in the Bible have made an impression on you?

What might keep you from letting loose and pouring it all out?

"But who am I to talk to God like that?" "After what I've done?" "Who am I to think that he might ever listen to me?" Who are you? God sees you, he calls you, he hears you as his, his own child. Even if everyone around you treats you like bleep, you get to know that they don't determine who you are or what God thinks of you. Even if it doesn't look like it or feel like it - you get to know - he sees you, calls you, hears you as his child to love. Yes, even after. Even after what you did. Even after what you said. Even after what you thought inside about him. That's why the Father gave us, gave you Jesus. To take what we've said and done and thought, to take it all to the cross and to pay the price for you and for me, to clear it all away. What does that mean for your prayers? With Jesus, God doesn't hear you as "somebody who needs to keep quiet, somebody who deserves to be shut up." No, God hears you as his son, his daughter - the son, the daughter that he loves with a big smile in his heart.

In our lesson, God heard Hannah. And when the time was right, God answered Hannah with a son. We're told Hannah named her son - "Shimu El," Samuel, "God heard."

God still hears. He hears you pour out your soul; he hears your hurt and your heart-ache; he hears your prayers. And when the time is right, he will answer. He will answer with his heart; he will answer with his head. He will answer for your good; even better, he will answer for his glory. He will answer as he promises: "Ask and it will be given you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened unto you."

What might be the difference between God answering with his heart and God answering with his head?

How might we say that God answering for his glory could be better than God answering for our good?

So what hurt, what heartache, what struggle are you going to pour out before the LORD? When you see family or friends pouring out their hearts to the LORD, how will you support them?

Our lesson today comes from a dark time in Hannah's life, a dark time for God's people, a dark time in the world. Inside and out, most people thought little of God and so they saw little of God. Sound familiar? But God still kept his ears and his heart open to the prayers of his people. He heard them then. And he hears you now. Amen.



HOLY, HOLY, HOLY






