Sermon followed by Service

Proverbs 31:10-31

September 26, 2021

No, it's not Mother's Day. And, no, I didn't lose a bet to my wife; I'm not in trouble with my wife; I'm not trying to dig myself out of a hole. If they - my mom and my wife - were counters and judgers, I'd be in too deep a hole, I'd be too deep in too many holes to ever get myself out. No, at Pastor Conference, this section of Proverbs just struck me as too beautiful, too important a section to just mention here or there, now and then.

What do you find to be beautiful or important in this section of Scripture?

We live in a world confused and misinformed about sex and gender, confused and misinformed about man and woman, male and female; confused and misinformed about strength and beauty; confused and misinformed about success. I could say we live in a world that doesn't appreciate manhood, especially Christian manhood. Even more so I could say that we live in a world that doesn't appreciate women, especially godly and Christian women. And it's not just the world out there that is confused and misinformed, not just the world out there that doesn't give women, especially godly women, the appreciation that God has for them.

For example, if I were to say and ask you: "Think about what Proverbs says about women. What's the first thing that comes to mind?" Would it be our lesson or "A quarrelsome wife is like a constant dripping on a rainy day"? Our lesson or "Better to live on a corner of the roof than share a house with a quarrelsome wife"? Which do we find easier to see and remember? Which do we find easier to tell others - How wonderful the women are that God has put in our lives? Or our gripe, our grumble, our growl against them? So let's clear the muck out of our hearts and minds and eyes and see the treasure God gives his world in good and godly women.

So what do we see in our lesson? A model. Not a swimsuit model or a fashion model or a hands model with soft, smooth skin. No, our model is modeling something deeper than the skin, something more beautiful than skin. Our model is modeling a heart and mind filled with the heart and mind of God. She is modeling hands working the work of God. As we see her pictures, as we see her "show her stuff," we see the heart and mind, the love and the life of God himself. We see a model of what God wants for us, a model of what God wants us to be. We see what to look for; we see what to be. We see God's heart and mind; we see God's life and love.

There's also something we don't see here. Pictures and scenes cut out from the album, left out of the portfolio; pictures and scenes erased, deleted, forgotten. Pictures and scenes, cut out, left out, erased, deleted, forgotten, why? Because they don't measure up. Something else we don't see is how the pictures have been airbrushed; we don't see the make-up on the model's warts and birthmarks. We know there has to be some of that. We know that there have to be pictures and scenes left out because we see those pictures and scenes that don't make the cut here on other pages of the Bible with Adam and Eve, David and Bathsheba, Mary and Martha, and in our own lives. We know there has to be some airbrushing and make-up because no one looks so picture perfect, not in the Bible, not in our own lives; no one looks so picture-perfect except for Jesus.

Does that mean that the picture in our lesson is a fake? No, the picture, the word-painting in our lesson is a faithful rendition of how God sees his model woman. The picture, the word-painting in our lesson is a faithful rendition of how God sees you with Jesus. We have birthmarks and warts that we don't want seen. Not just the skin kind, but warts and birthmarks on our heart, warts and birthmarks in our personality, marks and scars of ugly evil. We have pictures and scenes from our lives that we don't want seen; pictures and scenes that we want cut out, left out, erased, deleted, forgotten. Not just because they would embarrass us, but because they would damn us. We all have pictures and scenes from our past that if they were part of our present, they would disqualify us from God's family picture. We all have pictures and scenes from our past that we don't want to have to answer for or explain. We all have pictures and scenes from our past that we can't make right or pay for.

But Jesus did. He took those pictures and scenes as his own. He didn't just try to hide them, deny them, make excuses for them. No, he took them and all the guilt and shame associated with them. He took our guilt and red-faced shame to the cross, and there before God and the world he answered for it. Not with lies and excuses or "explanations," but with his life and death, his body and blood. Now, with Jesus, before God, those pictures and scenes that would damn us are cut out, left out, erased, deleted, forgotten. You are forgiven. And the marks and scars of our evil? Covered over with the perfect life of Jesus. In your baptism, you are washed and covered over with a picture of Jesus. Even better, in baptism you are

washed and covered over with Jesus himself. Now, with Jesus, God sees you as picture perfect. He sees you as his model child, his model wife; he sees you right for his family, right for his home in heaven, and right to represent him here in this world like the model in our lesson.

How does the model in our lesson represent God? Not just with an outer show, putting on a good show; the model in our lesson isn't stuck on looks. She has something more important going on than just putting on a show and looking good. She has her eye and her heart on the LORD. With her eye and her heart on the LORD, she is strong. She isn't lazy; she isn't looking to be served as a princess. No, she puts her whole self into doing, doing for others. She has a strong body and she puts it to work; she has a strong mind and she finds ways to do for others. She's strong, but she isn't just mind and muscle strong; with her heart and her eye on the Lord, she has a strong spirit. Not bully strong, not pushy strong, not "my way or the highway, get it right or else" strong, but strong and wise in a way that shows and shares kindness. Not strong for self, to get for self. But strong to serve, making sure her family is taken care of, even making sure strangers are taken care of.

Did you notice how serving and serving others is at the center of this picture? As a wife, she serves her husband; as a mother, she serves her children; as a woman, she sees what people need, she sees what she can do, and - with her heart and mind, with her strength and soul - she reaches out and she does.

Does this model remind you of anybody?

Does she remind you of anybody? Perhaps a mom, a grandma, a dear sister at church? Or perhaps she reminds you of Jesus. That's right, perhaps she reminds you of Jesus - seeing what needs to be done, serving, sacrificing, doing what needs to be done - like Jesus.


The man said,
