Classroom Rules:

1. Respect your classmates, other students, the teacher, and your Lord.

Classroom Expectations:

1. Use your God-given talents to the best of your ability.
2. When the teacher or another student is talking, you are listening.
3. Your personal space is yours only. Use it wisely.
4. Do your own work. Take responsibility for your learning!
5. Ask for help when you need it.
6. Homework will be completed and handed in on time.
7. When you have the chance to be a leader, take it.
8. Make responsible choices that benefit yourself and others.
9. School property is to be handled with care.

Homework Expectations:

1. I will do my best to assign homework according to the standard “ten minutes times the grade in school.”
2. Students are expected to complete all of their assignments and responsibilities to the best of their ability and in a timely manner.
3. Late assignments due to absences should be completed and turned in as soon as possible, but within reason.
4. Redos - Students who fail an assignment will be encouraged to redo it for the average of the two grades. If redos become a regular occurrence, parents will be notified to discuss how to best encourage faithful work and study habits.

Discipline:

1. Discipline will be administered with the understanding that we are all sinful human beings. Consequences will be determined on a case-by-case basis. They may include but are not limited to
 - Missing recess
 - Sitting by yourself at lunch
 - Moving to a different location in the classroom
 - Being sent to another classroom
 - Missing extracurricular activities
 - Detention
 - Suspension

While I pray the last two never have to be used, I believe it is important to have an orderly and respectful classroom that holds students accountable to their actions. In order to have a voice in correcting their misbehavior, the students may have a say in their consequences, but ultimately it is up to me to have the final say.

2. Actions that may require discipline may include but are not limited to
 - Talking while I am teaching
 - Interrupting while a student is answering or asking a question
 - Speaking out of turn
 - Being disruptive during work time
 - Not following directions
 - Being disruptive at lunch, recess, chapel, or in the hallway
 - Not respecting others

Warnings will be issued before disciplinary action is taken. After one warning, a student should expect discipline to be administered. Should behavior continue, parents will be notified, and if necessary, the principal and/or Board of Education will be informed.
